

of half a mile, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-described lane to a point, near the said farm, opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'N. St. P.' and 'St. J. D. C., 1869, No. 2,' and placed on the eastern side of the same lane, at or near to its junction with the footpath leading from Lipiat Farm aforesaid, to Monk's Farm; and extending thence, south-eastward, to such boundary stone, and along the middle of the said footpath to a boundary stone inscribed 'N. St. P. and St. J. D. C., 1869, No. 3,' and placed on the western side of Monk's-lane, at its junction, opposite to Monk's Farm aforesaid, with the same footpath; and extending thence, south-eastward, for a distance of thirty chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with the road leading from Monk's House to Corsham side; and extending thence north-westward, for a distance of ten chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-described road, to its junction with the road leading past Pond Close Farm to the close numbered 650 upon the Tithe Commutation Map of the said parish of Corsham, and upon the map hereunto annexed; and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described road to its southern end; and continuing thence still southward, and in a direct line, for a distance of ten chains, or thereabouts, across the close numbered 650, as aforesaid, to a boundary stone inscribed 'N. St. P. and St. J. D. C., 1869, No. 4,' and placed on the southern side of the same close upon the boundary, in the old Roman way, which divides the said parish of Corsham from the 'parish of Atworth, with South Wraxall annexed,' as aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the two several registries of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and at Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventh day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty,

chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church, situate at Appleton-upon-Wiske, in the parish of Great Smeaton, which said parish is situate in the county of York, and partly in the diocese of Ripon, and partly in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church, situate at Appleton-upon-Wiske as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Great Smeaton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church, situate at Appleton-upon-Wiske as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Appleton-upon-Wiske.'

"And, with the like consent of the said William, Archbishop of York, and of the said Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Appleton-upon-Wiske, being:—

"Of the parish of Great Smeaton, which is situate in the county of York and in the two dioceses of Ripon and York, all and only that part which is situate in the diocese of York as aforesaid, all which said part of such parish is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the township and chapelry of Appleton-upon-Wiske."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when
