WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a

scheme, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator, which is hereinafter mentioned and described (such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the Most Noble Richard, Marquis of Westminster, has paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England, the sum of three thousand pounds sterling, in aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and of the maintenance of the incumbent thereof for the time being, and we have in respect of such sum undertaken to provide and pay, in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May, and the first day of November, in each and every year, to such incumbent as aforesaid, so soon as one shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the herein secondly mentioned Act, and to his successors, the yearly sum of one hundred pounds.

"And whereas we have also agreed and undertaken to make and pay out of the 'Common Fund' created by the firstly herein-mentioned Act to the said incumbent, when duly licensed, and to his successors as aforesaid, a grant of fifty pounds per annum, which said grant will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand pounds sterling has been so paid by the said Richard, Marquis of Westminster, upon the understanding and condition, that we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the incumbent thereof, should be assigned to, and should be vested in, the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Carlisle, as the nominee of the said Richard, Marquis of Westminster, and the said Marquis has, by an instrument under his hand, nominated to us the Honourable and Right Reverend Samuel, now Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, and his successors, Bishops of the same diocese to be such patrons accordingly, and it appears to us to be expedient that the said right of patronage should be assigned and vested in accordance with such nomination.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Samuel, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this

scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose, that all that part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Cleator Moor.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district, so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Samuel, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, and by his successors, Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Cleator Moor, being:—

"All that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, which is bounded on the east and on the north partly by the ancient chapelry of Ennerdale and Kinniside, in the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Bees, and partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Arlecdon, on the north-west by the new parish of Saint John, Hensingham, on the west partly by the last-named new parish, and partly by the extra-parochial territory called or known as Low Keekle, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on the remaining side, that is to say, on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator from the extra-parochial territory, called or known as Low Keekle as aforesaid, at a point over the middle of the River Keekle on the southern side of the bridge, which carries the line of the Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway over the said river; and extending thence first eastward, and then north-eastward for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts along the line of fences, which form the southern boundary of the said line of railway, to a point at the southern end of the bridge, which carries the footpath leading from Crossfield towards Jacktrees over the same line of railway; and extending thence generally eastward, for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts, along the northern side of the said footpath to a point opposite to the north-western end of the fence which divides the houses and gardens numbered 203 upon the map of the Ordnance Survey of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty three, and upon the map hereunto annexed from the close numbered 246 upon the same maps; and extending thence south-eastward to and along the

middle of the said fence to its south-eastern end on the western side of the road at Jacktrees, which leads from Cleator to Cleator Moor; and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of two and a half chains, or thereabouts, along the western side of the last described road to a point opposite to the north-western end of a certain private road numbered 249 upon the said maps, which belongs to the Carron Iron Company, and leads towards Todhole's Iron Ore Pit; and extending thence south-eastward to and along the western side of the said private road to the said Todholes Pit; and continuing thence still south-eastward along the western side of the same pit to a point in the middle of the north-western end of the fence dividing the close numbered 388 upon the said maps from the close numbered 389 upon the same maps; and continuing thence still south-eastward along the middle of the last-described fence to its junction with the fence dividing the close numbered 390 upon the said maps from the closes numbered respectively 389 as aforesaid, and 392 upon the same maps; and extending thence alternately south-eastward and eastward along the middle of the last-described fence to a point in the middle of Trumpet Beck; and continuing thence first eastward and then southward along the middle of the said beck to a point on the southern side of Trumpet Bridge, which carries the road leading from Cleator to Wath over the same beck; and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to and along the south-eastern side of the last-described road to its junction with the Occupation road which is numbered 440 on the maps aforesaid, and which leads to Low Wath Corn Mill; and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the south-western side of the said Occupation-road (thereby passing to the north of the buildings called or known as Low Wath Corn Mill as aforesaid), to the eastern end of the same Occupation-road, on the western bank of the stream which supplies the same mill; and extending first eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the said stream to its junction with the River Ehen; and continuing thence still north-eastward for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts along the middle of the said river to the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cleator from the ancient chapelry of Ennerdale and Kinniside aforesaid."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly-mentioned Act been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the parish or parochial chapelry out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken; and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Carlisle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, intituled An Act to further amend the Acts relating to us, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting an exchange of certain lands and hereditaments belonging to the Archbishop of York for certain other lands and hereditaments belonging to us.

"Whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that if, after we have effected the endowment of any archbishoprick or bishoprick, or of any chapter, with lands or hereditaments, it shall appear to us that it would be beneficial to such archbishoprick or bishoprick, or to such chapter, that any part or parts of such lands or hereditaments should be exchanged for any lands or hereditaments belonging to any other archbishop or bishop or chapter, or to us, it shall be lawful to effect such exchange, with the consent, in writing, of every archbishop or bishop or chapter thereby affected, and by the authority of a scheme passed by us, and an Order of your Majesty ratifying the same: Provided always, that no such exchange shall be made unless we shall be satisfied of the reasonable equality in value of the lands and hereditaments so to be exchanged, and shall in such last-mentioned scheme make a statement to that effect.

"And whereas the endowment of the archbishoprick of York with lands and hereditaments was effected by means of an Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying a scheme prepared by us, which Order bore date the twenty-fifth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and was duly published in the London Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of the same month.

"And whereas it appears to us that it would be beneficial to the said archbishoprick of York, that the lands and hereditaments particularly described and set forth in the schedule annexed to this scheme, and marked A, being part of the lands and hereditaments wherewith the said archbishoprick was endowed as aforesaid, should be exchanged for certain lands and hereditaments now belonging to us, which are particularly described and set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, and marked B.

"And whereas we are satisfied of the reasonable equality in value of the lands and hereditaments proposed to be exchanged as hereinafter recommended.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose with the consent of the Right Honourable

and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, testified by his having signed this scheme, that from and after the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order, the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule, hereunto annexed and marked A, with their appurtenances and all the right, title, estate and interest therein, of the said Archbishop of York, and his successors, and all his and their right, title, and interest in any tithes, or rent charges in lieu of tithes, arising thereout or charged thereupon, and in the benefit of the perpetual land tax (if any) charged upon the same premises, shall be transferred to and vested in us and our successors, and that we shall thereupon become and be absolutely seised and possessed of the same in fee, and shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof, as from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and that in exchange for the lands and hereditaments so to be transferred and conveyed to us as aforesaid, the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and marked B, with their appurtenances, and all our right, title, estate, and interest therein (save and except and always reserved unto us and our successors, and our and their lessees, tenants, and assigns, all and singular the mines, quarries, and beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, minerals, and metalliferous substances of all descriptions therein or thereunder, with full and exclusive authority to sink, win, work, get up, and carry away the same in, under, out of, and from the said lands and hereditaments, or any other lands and hereditaments according to the course and practice at present or hereafter to be used or adopted in the county of York, or according to the most approved mode which may from time to time be used or invented, and to enter upon, take, use, and occupy from time to time, and for such time and in such manner as we, our successors, lessees, tenants, and assigns shall think fit, so much of the said lands and hereditaments as we shall deem necessary, proper, or convenient for all or any of the aforesaid purposes, making full compensation for any injury thereby occasioned, and save and except and always reserved full and exclusive authority for us, our successors, lessees, tenants, and assigns, or persons acting under our authority, and whether in reference or respect to lands held by or under us, or any other property, to make, grant, and use any way or ways upon, across, under, or through the said lands and hereditaments for the purposes aforesaid) together with all tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes arising thereout or charged thereupon, and the benefit of the perpetual land tax (if any) charged upon the same premises, shall, from and after the date of such gazetting as aforesaid, become and be absolutely vested in the said Archbishop and his successors in as full and ample a manner (saving the minerals and mineral rights aforesaid) as if the same had formed part of the ancient possessions of the said see, and that the said Archbishop shall become entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof, as from the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Ellesmere, in the county of

Salop, and in the diocese of Lichfield, and out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Ellesmere, and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton, hereinafter mentioned and described (such portions not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas by a certain deed, bearing date on or about the twentieth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, made under the authority of 'The New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,' or some or one of them, and being under the hand and seal of the Right Honourable Adelbert Wellington Brownlow, Earl Brownlow, and being also under the common seal of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (which deed is intended to be enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery at Westminster), the said Earl Brownlow did grant and confirm unto the incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed thereto according to the provisions of the herein secondly mentioned Act, and to his successors the incumbents thereof for the time being, all and every the tithes or commutation rents-charge in lieu of tithes, amounting together to the sum of one hundred and fourteen pounds ten shillings and sixpence yearly, arising and issuing out of or from certain lands in the township of English Frankton, and in the said parish of Ellesmere, which said tithes or rents-charge in lieu of tithes are more particularly specified in the schedule which forms part of and is referred to in the said deed.

"And whereas the said tithes or commutation rents-charge in lieu of tithes have been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding that we should make and pay, out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-mentioned Act, to the incumbent for the time being of the said intended district, when he shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid, a grant of fifty pounds per annum, and upon the further understanding and upon the condition that (such arrangement appearing

to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district, and of the nomination of the incumbent thereto, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid, by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Augustus, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, that all those portions of the said parish of Ellesmere and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Lineal-cum-Colemere.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the incumbent thereto, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Adelbert Wellington Brownlow, Earl Brownlow, his heirs and assigns, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Lineal - cum - Colemere, being :—

"All that portion of the parish of Ellesmere, in the county of Salop, and in the diocese of Lichfield, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the township of Lineal and of the township of Colemere.

"And also all those portions of the parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which are contiguous to the said township of Lineal, and are situate on the southern side of the Ellesmere Canal, all which said portions are comprised within and are co-extensive with the limits of the closes numbered respectively 677, 678, 699, 700, and 701, upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton and upon the map hereunto annexed.

"And also all that detached portion of the same parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton, situate at Blackhurst Ford, on the road leading from Welsh Hampton to Wem, which said portion is bounded on the north and on the west by the said township of Lineal, on the east partly by the parish of Hanmer, in the county of Flint, and in the diocese of Saint Asaph, and partly by the parish

of Wem, in the said county of Salop, and in the diocese of Lichfield aforesaid.

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the said parish of Ellesmere and of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Welsh Hampton, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868,' sections three and four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme relating to the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of Norwich.

"Whereas the said chapter now consists of a dean and four canons, two canonries having been suspended under the provisions of an Act passed in the session held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth Report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues.'

"And whereas the said dean and chapter have agreed with us that a scheme should be laid before your Majesty in Council for carrying into effect a transfer to us of part of the property belonging to them, for the considerations and upon the terms hereinafter set forth, which terms are in our opinion fair and reasonable, and the said dean and chapter have further agreed with us that such scheme should also comprise the incidental provisions hereinafter set forth, such provisions being necessary for carrying into effect the said transfer.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A, are vested in us in fee simple in possession, and the lands, tenements, hereditaments and securities particularly described in the

schedule hereunto annexed, marked B, are part of the property of the said dean and chapter.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of Norwich, and of the Honourable and Right Reverend John Thomas, Bishop of Norwich, as visitor of the said dean and chapter (testified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals), we humbly recommend and propose, that all the manors, lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments which now belong, either in possession or reversion, to the said dean and chapter (excepting all rights of ecclesiastical patronage, the cathedral church and the precincts thereof, and all messuages, lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the said precincts, which now belong, either in possession or reversion, to the said dean and chapter, or any of them, or any of their officers in right of their offices, and all their capitular rights, liberties, and jurisdictions within the same precincts, and also, excepting the lands, tenements, hereditaments, and securities particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked B) shall, together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax charged thereupon which has been redeemed, upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly published in the London Gazette, be transferred to us in the manner contemplated by the said first mentioned Act, and that we shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said manors, lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments so to be transferred to us, as from the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and that, in consideration of and for such transfer, the lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments particularly set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed marked A, together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax charged thereon which has been redeemed, shall, upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette be transferred to the said dean and chapter in manner contemplated by the said first mentioned Act, and that they the said dean and chapter shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof as from the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and that in further consideration of and for such transfer to us as aforesaid we shall surrender all right and be excluded from all participation in respect of the said suspended canonries to and in the estates and property to be retained by the said dean and chapter, or to be by any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or by any other order made under the said first mentioned Act transferred to them as part of their permanent endowment and in the rents and profits thereof, and in the money payments hereinafter mentioned and that in further consideration of and for such transfer to us as aforesaid there shall be paid by us by equal half-yearly payments on the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September, in every year to the said dean and chapter, the annual sum of two thousand and six hundred pounds, and that the payment of such annual sum shall continue until the said dean and chapter shall have been under the authority provided by the said first mentioned Act put into possession in fee simple of real estates of which not more than two third parts shall consist of title rent charges sufficient to secure to the said dean and chapter in addition to the income which the said dean and chapter will derive from the estates proposed by this scheme to be transferred to and to be retained by them, a clear annual

income therefrom after deducting rates, taxes, the cost of agency, and other outgoings amounting to the said annual sum of two thousand and six hundred pounds.

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall also be paid by us by equal half-yearly payments to the said dean and chapter, on the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September, in every year during the life of John Kitson, Esquire, the present chapter clerk, of the said dean and chapter a sum of two hundred pounds (such last mentioned sum to be by them appropriated and paid to the said John Kitson, in respect of the profits which would have accrued to him on account of the management of the estates hereby proposed to be transferred to us) and that the first half-yearly payment in respect of each of the hereinbefore mentioned annual sums of two thousand and six hundred pounds and two hundred pounds shall be made on the twenty-fifth day of March next.

And we further recommend and propose, that as the consideration for the loss which the said dean and chapter have incurred by having abstained from renewing certain leases of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments hereby proposed to be transferred to us which became renewable prior to the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, there shall be paid by us to the said dean and chapter, immediately upon the publication as aforesaid of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, a sum of five thousand and two hundred pounds, and that the receipt or receipts of the treasurer for the time being of the said dean and chapter shall be a good and valid discharge to us for all or any and every such sum or sums of money as shall therein be expressed to have been paid to him by us under the authority of this scheme when ratified as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that as a further consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid, a capital sum of twelve thousand pounds shall be set apart by us to be expended to our satisfaction in substantial repairs, restoration, and improvements of the said cathedral church, and of the buildings belonging thereto, and that interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum shall be allowed by us to the said dean and chapter; as from the said twenty-ninth of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, upon the said capital sum of twelve thousand pounds, and on the balances thereof from time to time remaining in our hands, such interest to be also expended to our satisfaction in substantial repairs of the said cathedral church and buildings.

"And we further recommend and propose, with the like consent of the said dean and chapter and of their visitor, that the sums of stock and cash which are specified in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked C, and also any other sums of stock and cash which may be now invested or held in trust for the said dean and chapter, except such sums of stock and cash as may be held by the said dean and chapter in trust for any special or charitable purposes, which last-mentioned sums are to be retained by the said dean and chapter, shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold out or transferred, and the same or the proceeds thereof be paid or carried to our account at the Bank of England.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

1 and 2. The Chancellor's fee includes the approval of plans, the perusal of the petition and other papers, the settling the sentence, and the approval of the Draft Act.
