THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at the Havana, reporting that, by a Decree of the Captain-General of Cuba, the following export duties came into force on the 1st March, 1869; viz.:—

Half a dollar per box of sugar.

One and a quarter dollar per hogshead of Muscovado sugar.

One dollar per bale of leaf tobacco. Half a dollar per thousand cigars.

From the same date, an additional five per cent. was to be levied on all import duties; and the merchants were to pay 25 per cent. additional for their licenses.

These extra dues are stated to be provisional, and levied only to meet the extraordinary expenses attending the insurrection in the Island of Cuba.
