### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the pre-

sentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS a part of the Port of Hull, in the East Riding of the county of York, has been defined by an Order of the Privy Council, bearing date the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, as a part of that port within which foreign cattle may be landed, and in such Order it is provided that all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part, and it is advisable to make provision for the re-shipment of such cattle for the purpose of their being conveyed to the Port of Goole, in the West Riding of the county of York:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every

other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby order as follows :—

1. From and after the eleventh day of this present month of April, notwithstanding anything in the said Order, foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the Port of Hull may, under such regulations as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs from time to time prescribe, be re-shipped therefrom and conveyed by vessel direct to the Port of Goole.

2. Provided that all cattle so re-shipped shall continue to be deemed foreign cattle.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires and Consul-General at Lima, reporting that a Law has been voted by the Peruvian Congress which imposes a stamp duty on certain documents.

The following are the Articles of this Law :—

ART. 1. Every document of credit, either being a contract or its liquidation will require a stamp in the scale set forth by this enactment.

ART. 2. The stamps are to be of the following classes and values :

- 1st Class. Of twenty sols each stamp.
- 2nd Class. Of ten sols each stamp.
- 3rd Class. Of five sols each stamp.
- 4th Class. Of one sol each stamp.
- 5th Class. Of twenty-five cents each stamp.
- 6th Class. Of ten cents each stamp.

ART. 3. Custom-house papers are subject to the stamp duties on a scale as follows :—

- 1st. Large manifests to have a stamp of the 4th class for each copy.
- 2nd. Small manifests, policies of trans-shipment and re-shipment, a stamp of the 5th class.
- 3rd. Policies of clearance and of export a stamp of the 6th class.

ART. 4. The stamp duties on other kinds of documents are to be paid as follows :—

1st. For commercial accounts, receipts, invoices, policies of marine insurance and generally all sorts of private bills not specified in this law amounting from twenty up to five hundred sols, a stamp of the 6th class is required; and from five hundred sols up to a thousand sols a stamp of the 5th class adding a similar stamp in equal proportion, viz., one of the 6th class for every 500 sols or fraction thereof, and one of the 5th class for every 1000 sols or fraction above 500.

2nd. On bills of exchange drawn and payable within national territory as high in amount as ten thousand sols, a stamp of the sixth class is required for every 500 sols, or fraction above 100 sols, amounting to above 10,000 sols, a stamp of the sixth class for every thousand sols, or fraction above 500.

3rd. On promissory notes and Fire and Life Insurance Policies a stamp of the fourth class for every 1,000 sols up to 5,000, above this amount, two stamps of the fifth class for every 1,000 sols, or fraction of 500; from 100 to 500 sols, a stamp of the fifth class, and from twenty to 100 sols a stamp of the sixth class.

4th. On law documents, being obligations, renewals of agreements, acknowledgements of debts, or companies with a constituted capital, stamps of the fifth class are to be affixed, equivalent to one per cent. of the amount specified in the document.

5th. On transfers of monies and furniture, or on shares of industrial or mercantile companies, stamps equivalent to one-half per cent. of their specified amounts are to be affixed.

6th. On account-sales, cessions, gifts, and in general on all contracts of transfer of immovable property, or on shares or rights of immovables, stamps are to be fixed equivalent to two per cent. on the value of said immovables.

ART. 5. Banks of issue pay annually in stamps on the amount of notes issued during the year, which has to be testified to by the General Accountant, the value which would correspond to the quadruple of this amount according to § 3 of the 4th Article; cheques drawn on these banks are exempted herefrom.

ART. 6. Documents wherein the Government may constitute one of the parties are not exempt from the stamp duty.

ART. 7. Wherever a deficiency of stamps is found out to exist as not in accordance with the foregoing regulations, a fine of four times the amount of stamps required by such documents is imposed.

ART. 8. The stamp duties must be paid by those signing the document, unless a different arrangement has been consented to.

ART. 9. In deeds of gift wherein the value is not set forth, the granters have, previously to the signing of the deed, to apply for a valuation of the object in question. Said valuation to be made by two valutors named, one by the administrator of the respective public treasury or the political authority in places where no such offices exist, and the other by the interested party—in case of non-agreement the two valutors are to appoint an umpire.

In gifts of immoveable property the valuation may be dispensed with, the item paid for territorial contribution to serve as a basis, calculated over a value of six per cent. annually on the one the ground is worth.

ART. 10. The stamp shall be sold in the Fiscal offices only; these may entrust a sub-sale to persons

giving the required sureties and entitling them to three per cent. on the sale; to this per centage on the sale of stamps public employes are not entitled.

ART. 11. The contribution styled "alienation tax" (alcabala de enajeciones) is henceforth abolished. Stamped paper will only be required to be used in judicial or administrative matters, registers, certificates, witness deeds, and other notarial Acts.

ART. 12. Notaries legalizing indentures in contravention of this law, shall be suspended from the exercise of their functions for a term of six months.

ART. 13. The stamp duty is different from that paid in Custom-houses under the name of paper for documents.

ART. 14. Administrators of Custom-houses are not to permit that paper to be issued for manifests, policies, &c., without the corresponding stamp, they being responsible for double the amount where and whenever papers of this class are without the required stamp.

ART. 15. In cases in which the stamp is paid at the rate of so much per hundred, a stamp of ten cents for fractions above twenty sols has to be affixed.

ART. 16. The following documents are exempted from the stamp duty:—

1st. Attestations or certified copies issued by public notaries.

2nd. Judicial trusts.

3rd. Cancellation of public and private documents whereon the stamp duty has been paid at the time of issue.

4th. Contracts or accounts in which the State is the debtor.

5th. Accounts and invoices respecting consignments of guano.

6th. Leases and dockets, not being principal documents.

7th. Letters of payment and all receipts for money not especially set forth in this Law, order-letters, when simple recommendations, not producing obligations.

8th. Receipts for good accounts to public employes or pensioners of the State.

9th. Passage tickets of public employes travelling on service, and those by prisoners, whose expenses for passage are paid for by the State. And—

10th. Indentures of sale effected within the Republic on property abroad; but not so the receipt for the amount paid over on account of the obligation on the balance remaining to be paid.

ART. 17. The sum total of the estimates of employes, and the lists or plans made for the payment of artisans and labourers, is to be considered as one receipt only for the payment of stamps.

ART. 18. In the absence of stamped paper, common paper may be used, with the corresponding stamps heading the document.

ART. 19. The executive is authorized to take steps deemed to be necessary in order to avoid all frauds that might be committed with respect to this Law.

London Brighton and South Coast and Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Companies, Amalgamation.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that (pursuant to the Award of His Grace the Duke of Richmond, made under the authority of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Act, 1868, and the Articles of Agreement set forth in the Schedule to that Act) application is intended to be forthwith made to Parliament for leave to bring in a Bill, in the present Session, for the purposes or some of the purposes following, viz.:

1. To transfer to and vest in the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company (hereinafter called "the Brighton Company"), all the undertaking, railways, works, lands, real and personal property, powers, authorities, rights of action and suit, and all other the rights and interests of the Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Company (hereinafter called the Surrey and Sussex Company), subject to the debts, liabilities, obligations, and engagements of the Surrey and Sussex Company, and to amalgamate that Company with or merge it in the Brighton Company.

2. To cancel and annul or direct the cancellation of the bond given to the Crown under "The Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Act, 1865," and to make other provision for securing the completion of the railways and works authorized by that Act as amended by "The Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Act, 1867," and to subject the Brighton Company to penalties or other obligations for securing the completion thereof by them.

3. To confirm and give effect to the transfer to the Brighton Company of all shares and stock in the Surrey and Sussex Company, and of all the debts, liabilities, obligations, and engagements of the Surrey and Sussex Company, and to enable the Brighton Company to exercise in their own name (and on the security of their own undertaking, or of the Surrey and Sussex Company's undertaking, or of both) the Surrey and Sussex Company's powers of borrowing and re-borrowing, or to repeal those powers, and to give the Brighton Company other powers of borrowing on mortgage in lieu thereof.

4. To declare valid and binding on the Brighton Company all payments out of the capital and moneys of the Surrey and Sussex Company, and all acts and proceedings of that Company and of its Directors; and to provide that the Brighton Company shall indemnify the said Directors and the Sureties in the before mentioned bond.

5. To dissolve the Surrey and Sussex Company.

6. To confirm and give complete legal effect in all respects to the said Award.

7. To provide for the payment by the Brighton Company of the costs of the Bill, and of any watching petition which Leo Schuster and others, now or late the Directors of the Surrey and Sussex Company, may present, and of the appearance thereon.

8. To authorize the Brighton Company to apply for the purposes of the Bill and Award any money, shares and stock which they have raised or issued, or are now authorized to raise or issue.

9. To amend "The Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Act, 1865;" "The Surrey and Sussex Junction Railway Act, 1867;" "The London Brighton, and South Coast Railway (Capital and Powers) Act, 1866;" "The London Brighton and South Coast Railway Act, 1867;" and "The London Brighton and South Coast Railway Act, 1868."

10. To levy new tolls, rates and duties on the Surrey and Sussex Junction Railways, and to vary those now authorized to be taken thereon, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment thereof.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

#### Thames Conservancy.

Pursuant to the Thames Conservancy Act, 1864, Section 31.
