And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty, that the said new bye-law is reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Prizy Council, is pleased to approve, and doth hereby approve of, and signify Her consent to the said new bye-law in lieu of the bye-law No. 47; hereinbefore recited.

## PŘEŠÉNT.

. The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the lifty-ninth year of His Majesty King. George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nine-teenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate at Holbeach Marsh, in the parish of Holbeach, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mark, situate at Holleach Marsh, as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of the said dioese of Lincoln (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Holbeach, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mark, situate at Holbeach Marsh as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Holbeach Marsh."

Saint Mark, Holbeach Marsh.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Christopher, Bishop of the said diecese—of Lincoln (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banus of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banus and of the solemnization of performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference:

The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Holbeach Marsh, being :—

"All that part of the parish of Holbeach, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln, which is bounded on the east by the district of Drove End, sometime part of the parish of Gedney, in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the north by the Wash, on the west partly by the parish of Moulton and partly by the parish of Whaplode, both in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on the remaining side, that is to say on the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named parish from the parish of Holbeach aforesaid, at a point in the middle of a certain drain dividing the close numbered 726 upon the tithe commutation may of the said parish of Holbeach, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the close numbered 727 upon the same maps; and extending thence horth-eastward along the middle of the said drain to its junction with the Holbeach Old River, opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'H. M. St. M., D. C., 1869, No. 1,' and placed on the western side of Old Sluice-road; and continuing thence still northeastward and in a direct line first to such boundary stone, and then to a point in the middle of the said road; and extending thence southward for a distance of six hundred and sixty yards or thereabouts along the middle of the same road to a point opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'H. M. St. M., D. C., 1869, No. 2, and placed on the eastern side of the same road, in the iniddle of the western end of the lence dividing the close numbered 706 upon the said maps from the close numbered 763 upon the same maps; and ex-
