REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a

Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

QUALIFICATION OF PUBLIC VACCINATORS.

WHEREAS it is required under the Regulations set forth in the Order of the Lords of the Privy Council, dated 1st December, 1859, that persons to be thereafter contracted with by the Guardians and Overseers of Unions and Parishes in England for the performance of public vaccination shall (except in certain cases) produce a certificate of proficiency in vaccination given, after due instruction and examination, by some Public Vaccinator whom the Privy Council authorizes to act for that purpose:—

Notice is hereby given that, subject to the same conditions as their Lordships have heretofore appointed in the like matter, and subject also to their Lordships' further orders, Dr. Robert D. Tannahill, of 106, Bath-street, Glasgow, officiating as Public Vaccinator at the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow, is authorized to give certificates for the purposes of the aforesaid Order to persons whom he, at his appointed station, shall have instructed in vaccination.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 30th day of April, 1869.

The yearly Fairs which the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of the city of Worcester, and their successors are authorized and empowered to hold in that city, shall after the 1st of June next, be held on the first and third Mondays in January, February, March, April, May, June, July, and August, on the first Monday and on the 19th of September, on the first and third Mondays in October and November, on the first Monday in December, and a Special Christmas Fair on the 16th of December, unless the 16th falls on a Saturday or Sunday, in which case the latter Fair to be held on the Monday following.

INTERNATIONAL FINE ARTS EXHIBITION
AT MUNICH, IN JULY, AUGUST, AND SEPTEMBER.

1. The Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Committee of Privy Council on Education have received, through Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a note from the Bavarian Minister in London, relating to an International Fine Arts Exhibition, under the special patronage of the King of Bavaria, to be held at Munich from the middle of July to the end of September next.

2. The Commission for the direction of the Exhibition is composed of delegates from the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, and from the Society of Artists, at Munich.

3. The Bavarian Government proposes to award, through a Jury to be named by the Commission, special marks of distinction to Artists whose works may be considered to be of remarkable merit.

4. The Bavarian Consul at Paris, M. Schwab, is appointed Commissioner-General for England and other countries to the west of Germany.

5. Works of painting, sculpture, architecture, engraving, and lithography, are admissible.

6. Copies, photographs, and other mechanical reproductions, will not be admissible.

7. Objects will be received up to the 15th June, and should be preceded by a notice, addressed, post-paid, "A la Commission Directrice de l'Exposition Générale des Beaux-Arts à Munich." This notice should contain the name (surname and Christian name) and the address of the artist, and a description of the object sent. If the object is for sale, the price should be stated.

8. There will be a lottery for the disposal of objects of art.

9. The Commission will take all needful precautions for the safety of the works sent for exhibition, but will not be responsible for accidents in their transmission. The objects will be insured against fire during the Exhibition.

10. The Commission undertakes to defray the expenses of transport, both going and returning, under certain conditions (see below); but expenses incurred by senders will not be refunded. For objects exceeding three quintals (three cwt.), special arrangements must be made.

The following note and enclosure, relating to the transport, free of charge, on the Bavarian State lines, of articles destined for the Exhibition, have also been forwarded to the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, by direction of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs:—

With the view of promoting the International Art Exhibition taking place here under the protection of the King this year, it has been determined by the under-written Royal Department to grant full exemption from taxation on the Bavarian State railways to all pictures and works of art in the departments of sculpture, architecture, engraving, and lithography, sent to the said Exhibition and returning from it unsold, on the following conditions:—

1. The consignments must be addressed to the Committee for the International Art Exhibition at Munich, and must be accompanied by a regular bill of lading.

Consignments which are addressed to despatching houses here to be delivered to the Committee must have a certificate from the Art Union, the Society of Arts, or a public authority of the place from which they come, stating that the consignment is an article for the Exhibition.

2. The articles will be treated as ordinary freight-goods, they cannot be forwarded free by express. The certificates which accompany the consignments on the homeward way to Munich are to be attached to the letters of freight, and to remain with them as vouchers.

3. Reimbursements on the value of the consignments will not be allowed, and only previous freights and small expenses will be undertaken and charged on, without commission.

4. Paintings and objects of art must be carefully packed; no responsibility will be undertaken for damages in consequence of imperfect packing.

No insurance of the value of the consignments intended for free transport will be allowed, and therefore, in cases of loss or damage occasioned by the negligence of the railway authorities, the value of the consignments will not be reckoned higher than 20 thalers per centner according to the regulations for goods-traffic.

Any difficulties in regard to the nature of the consignments must be immediately announced and attested by the Committee here, and no subsequent reclamation is admissible.

5. The consignments cannot be allowed to remain at the railway stations; the Committee or the despatching houses concerned must make arrangements for the speedy receipt and removal of the consignments from the stations.

6. On the return transport the exemption from taxation only applies to those consignments which are going back unsold to the exhibitor, or the place from which they originally came, in the ordinary time for delivery.

Each return consignment is in this case to have a certificate from the Exhibition Committee stating the contents, that the article remained unsold, and is going back to the place whence it originally came; and the presence of the certificate is to be noted in the letters of freight. The bills of lading are to be made out by the Exhibition Committee, or by the agent through whom the return consignment is made.

Pictures that are sold and objects of art, and such as are not going back with the address of the Exhibitor to the place whence they originally came, but are addressed to another place, lose their claim to be forwarded tax free.

The General Board of the Royal Traffic Establishment is to make the further arrangements accordingly in due time, and especially to make it the duty of the officials and servants to treat the consignments with proper care and attention.

With regard to any contingent favourable arrangements on the Eastern railways of Bavaria the decision is reserved.
