## REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to

be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Archangel, reporting that by an order of the Russian Government, dated the 19th March last, masters of vessels arriving at that port with cargo will not be required to produce bills of lading at the Custom-house, and that the production of the ship's manifest will be considered sufficient.

THE Board of Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of instructions which have been issued by the Captain-General of the Island of Puerto Rico, of which the following is a copy.

*Captain-Generalcy of the Island of  
Puerto Rico, Head Quarters.*

REGULATIONS to be observed by the Sentinels of the Castle of the Morro, to prevent Vessels entering the Port at night.

1st. No vessel, national or foreign, will be permitted to enter the port at night, unless obliged by distress, storm, or other motive which in prudence may be considered reasonable; in which case, should the entry be permitted, the Governor of the Morro Castle shall inform the Governor of the city, specifying the class of vessel, whence proceeding, flag, and his reason for permitting the entry.

2nd. Excepted from the prohibition mentioned in the foregoing regulation, are all national vessels of war, national mail steam ships, and the coasting steamer, to whom entry shall be permitted.

3rd. For the manner of distinguishing vessels named in the foregoing regulation, which may present themselves, the Governor of the Morro

Castle shall make arrangements that the sentinels of the Macho and Lower Batteries, the moment they perceive any vessel approaching, shall look out regularly and frequently to sea, and give the alarm, when the before-named Governor shall personally go and verify if this be making for the port; and if not comprehended in the exceptions of Regulation No. 2, shall order them to withdraw and bring-to until the morning, informing the captain of the ship that vessels are prohibited from entering the port at night. If, notwithstanding this notice, which must be repeated in case he should not have heard or misunderstood upon the first summons, the vessel shall continue its course toward the port; the Governor of the Morro shall order a gun to be fired, wide and without ball, which notice shall be repeated in a short time, if necessary, again without ball; if, after this, the vessel does not obey, he will prevent her or their entry, firing with ball, providing they are not excepted in Regulation No. 1.
