By Art. 6 of the Decree of the 22nd November last, all the dues then exacted from vessels arriving in Spanish Ports were amalgamated in one single duty, called the "duty on unloading cargo" (de descarga), and was fixed as follows:—

- II. Vessels engaged in the trade between the said ports and all those of European nations, of the Asiatic Coast of the Mediterranean, of the African Coast of the Mediterranean, and of the Atlantic as far as Cape Mogador:

III. Vessels engaged in the trade between Spanish Ports and those of all other nations not mentioned in Class II:

and subjects them to the following dues, respectively, which are the same as hitherto for Classes I. and III., but are considerably reduced for Class II.:—
