AT the Court at Windsor, the 18th day of June, 1869.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that, upon the completion of any new lighthouse, buoy, or beacon, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount thereof; and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions, in, by, and subject to which the light dues authorized to be levied by this Act are paid and collected:

And whereas the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses are erecting and are about to light a new lighthouse at Dune Point, on the western shore of Lochindail, Islay:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in exercise of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, that upon the lighting of the said light, there shall be paid in respect thereof, for every vessel, whether British or foreign, which may enter or leave Lochindail, or cross an imaginary line drawn between Oversay Island and Rudha-na-Cathair or Western Point of the Hò, the toll of fourpence per ton of the burthen of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom, whether on an over-sea or a coasting voyage.

The said toll shall be levied by the Commissioners of northern lighthouses; subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the new consolidated table of light dues sanctioned by an Order in Council, dated the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and to, the gross abatement or discount of fifty per cent. mentioned in an Order in Council, dated the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from Her Majesty's Consul at Galveston, a copy of an Order issued by the Mayor of that city, establishing quarantine on all vessels arriving at that port.

Until visited by the Health Officer, no vessel will be allowed to communicate with the shore, or with other vessels.

All vessels free from disease, not in a foul condition, and not coming from ports infected with any epidemic disease, will receive from the health officer permits to pass the quarantine station. Vessels arriving from infected ports, but with clean bills of health, and having had no case of infectious or contagious disease on board during the voyage, will be quarantined for twenty-one days from the date of leaving the infected port. Vessels that have had a case of infectious or contagious disease on board during the voyage will be quarantined for twenty-one days from the date of the disappearance of the last case. In cases where there is reason to suspect that a case of sickness has occurred during the voyage, the vessel will be detained under observation, for such length of time, not exceeding twenty-one days, as the health officer may deem proper.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—

ABERDARE.

ORDER FOR DIVISION OF ABERDARE DISTRICT INTO WARDS.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, is in force in the district of the Local Board of Health of Aberdare, in the county of Glamorgan, to which district the Public Health Act, 1848, has been applied, and a resolution of the said Board has been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the 24th section of the said Local Government Act, for a division of the said district into wards, and that I may declare the proportion of the twelve members constituting that Board to be elected by and for each of such wards.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby order and direct:—

1. That the district of Aberdare, in the county of Glamorgan, shall, from and after the date of this Order, be divided for the purpose of election of the Local Board for such district into four wards, and that the boundaries of the said several wards be as are hereinafter described and shewn upon the plan accompanying this Order, and numbered respectively 1, 2, 3, and 4, viz.:—

No. 1, or North Ward.—To comprise all that portion of the said district which is bounded on the west by the hamlet of Rhigis, on the north by the parish of Penderyn, on the east by the boundary dividing the parish of Aberdare from the parish of Merthyr Tydfil, and on the south by a line commencing at the boundary of the said parishes and following the line of boundary between the Ysgnborwen and Abernant estates to the River Cynon, thence north-westward along the River Cynon to the Great Western Railway Bridge at Gadby's Uchaf, thence southward, along the Great Western Railway to the parish road leading to Robert's Town, thence westward along the centres of such parish road Meibion-street and Mount-pleasant to the Hirwain-road, thence south-eastward along the Park-wall to Glan-road, thence westward along the centre of Glan-road to the Dare river, thence across and along the Dare river south-eastward to the boundary of the Tyfry and Cwm Farms, thence southward along the Tyfry boundary until it strikes the boundary of Blaengwawr Mountain, thence along the boundary of Blaengwawr Mountain until it strikes the Nant Hafod Brook, thence along the Nant Hafod Brook to its confluence with the Amman Vach Brook, thence westward along such brook until it strikes the Mardy Mountain, thence along the north-west boundary of the Mardy Mountain until it joins the Rhondda Vach river, thence northward along such river boundary dividing the parish of Aberdare from the hamlet of Rhigis.

No. 2, or Higher Town Ward.—To comprise all that portion of the said district which is bounded on the north by a line following the boundary between the Ysgnborwen and Abernant Estates to the River Cynon, thence north-westward along the River Cynon to the Great Western Railway bridge at Gadby's Uchaf, thence southward along the Great Western Railway to the

parish road leading to Robert's Town, thence westward along the centre of such parish road and the centres of Meibion-street and Mount-pleasant to the Hirwain-road, thence south-eastward along the Park-wall to Glan-road, thence westward along the centre of Glan-road to the Dare river, thence across and along the Dare river eastward to the boundary of the Tyfry and Cwm Farms, thence southward along the Tyfry boundary until it strikes the boundary of Blaengwawr Mountain on the east by the parish of Merthyr, and on the south by the boundary separating the Abernant Estate and Werfa Estate, and following such boundary to the viaduct on the Merthyr Branch of the Great Western Railway, thence westward along the Nant Gangarn Brook to the Old Cynon, thence along the boundary between the Abernant Meadows and the Ynyscynon Farm to the River Cynon, thence northwards along the River Cynon to its confluence with the River Dare, thence westward along the River Dare to the Duke-street Bridge, thence southward along Duke-street, and along the centre of Market-street, to Commercial-place, thence westward along the centres of Commercial place and Monk-street or Rhywmynach until it strikes the boundary of the Blaengwawr Mountain.

No. 3, or Lower Town Ward.—To comprise all that portion of the said district which is bounded on the north-west by a line drawn westward from the boundary line separating the parish of Merthyr Tydfil from the parish of Aberdare, and following the boundary between the Abernant Estate and the Werfa Estate to the viaduct on the Merthyr Branch of the Great Western Railway, thence westward along the Nant Gengarn Brook to Old Cynon, thence along the boundary between the Abernant Meadows and the Ynyscynon Farm to the River Cynon, thence northwards along the River Cynon to its confluence with the River Dare, thence westward along the River Dare to Duke-street Bridge, thence southward along Duke-street, and along the centre of Market-street to Commercial-place, thence westward along the centre of Commercial-place and Monk-street or Rhiwmynach until it strikes the boundary of the Blaengwawr Mountain, thence westward along such mountain until it strikes the Hafodwen on the east by the boundary line separating the parish of Aberdare from the parish of Merthyr Tydfil, on the south by the fence-wall running from Castell Meilion westward, and dividing the estates of the Marquis of Bute and the Baroness Windsor, until such wall joins the Nantygroes Brook, thence westward along such brook to Old Cynon, thence southwards along Old Cynon to its confluence with the River Cynon, thence along the River Cynon north-westward to the boundary between the Abergwawr and Aberaman Ucha Farms, thence along the boundary of the said farms to the mountain, thence to the southern boundary of Blaengwawr Farm, and along such southern boundary until it joins the Hafodwen.

No. 4, or South Ward.—To comprise all that portion of the said district which is bounded on the north by the fence wall running from Castell Meibion westward, and dividing the estates of the Marquis of Bute and the Baroness Windsor, until such wall joins the Nantygroes brook, thence westward along such brook to Old Cynon, thence southward along Old Cynon to its confluence with the River Cynon, thence along the River Cynon north-westward to the boundary between the Abergwawr and Aberaman Ucha Farms, thence

along the boundary of the said farms to the mountain, thence to the southern boundary of Blaengawr Farm, and along such southern boundary of Blaengawr Farm until it joins the Nant Hafodewen, thence along Nant Hafodewen to the Aman Vach brook, thence westward along such brook until it strikes the Mardy Mountain, thence northward along such Mardy Mountain until it strikes the Rhondda Vach river, on the east by the boundary-line separating the parish of Aberdare from the parish of Merthyr Tydfil, on the west by the River Rhondda Vach, and on the south by the boundary-line separating the district of the Aberdare Local Board of Health from the Mountain Ash Local Board District, and thence westward along the boundary dividing the parishes of Aberdare and Llanwonno until it reaches the Rhondda Vach river.

2. That three members be elected for each of the hereinbefore described wards for such Local Board of Health, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858.

Candidates must not be less than 18 or more than 21 years of age, and must have served at least two years in private shipbuilding or engineering establishments, or must give satisfactory proof that they have in some way been so connected with shipbuilding or engineering operations as to become well-grounded in the elementary principles and practice thereof.

The pupils will be selected by competitive examination, the subjects for which, and numbers of marks assigned for each, are as follows :—

No candidate will be admitted who does not obtain at least two-thirds of the full number of marks in the two first-named subjects, and three-fifths of the full number, either for practical shipbuilding or marine engineering.

The last four subjects, although counting in the competition, will not be considered obligatory.

The candidates who may be selected will be treated, while attached to the school, in all respects as the Admiralty pupils; they will receive wages the same as dockyard apprentices, commencing at 1s. 6d. per day for six days per week for first year, and increasing yearly 3d. per day till it reaches 2s. per day; and in addition a subsistence allowance of 3s per day for seven days per week while away from their homes, either at the school or in the dockyards.

Seven months of each year—viz., from October till May—will be devoted to study at the school, and the remaining five months to actual work and the acquirement of practical knowledge in the dockyards.
