To the King's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Adreff of Your Majesty's moft Loyal and Dutyful Subjects, the Grand Jury of Your City and Countie of Exeter, held at the Guild-Hall of the faid City, the 23d day of April, in the Fourth Year of Your Majesty's Reign, being the Anniverfary Day folemnized for Your Majesty's Coronation.

Moft Dread Sovereign!

Since it hath pleas'd the King of Kings to bring Your Majesty to the Crown, and Seat You on the Throne of Your Illuftrious Anceftors on this day, we thought it our duty, not only to thank the Great God of Heaven for this univerfal Bleffing, which we did perform with Hearts unfeign'd full of Joy, and thoroughly fenfible of that great Happinefs, which it hath pleas'd the over-ruling Providence to blefs us with, under Your Majesty's moft gracious and merciful Government. But as we are bound to thank God for this great Bleffing, fo we judge our felves likewise engag'd, by all the Obligations imaginable, to return our Thanks to Your Sacred Majesty, God's true Viceregent, whofe Actions have furpaffed any thing that Hiftory could yet afford us, and whofe gracious and unparallel'd Declaration for Liberty of Confcience hath come up to that agreeablenefs of Divinity it felf, who hath faid of Kings, I have made you Gods; that you, Great SIR, have exceeded all Princes in that high and tranfcendent Character: We crave leave, moft Gracious Sovereign, to render unto Your Majesty our moft unfeign'd Thanks for thofe frefh Obligations and Priviledges, lately granted to this your Ancient and Loyal City, in your new Charter, humbly affuring Your Majesty, that when ever you fhall please to call a Parliament, we fhall give our Affiftance in choofing fuch Members as, we doubt not, will readily concur to perpetuate that great and good Work, which Your Majesty to your Eternal Honour and Glory have fo happily begun.

May the Great God of Heaven make your Majesty's Reign long and prosperous over us, and grant Your Majesty and Your Royal Confort a numerous and lafting Ifue; that as this Generation hath great caufe to blifs God for you, fo future Generations may rife up and call You and your Royal Progeny, for ever blefs'd.

So Pray heartily Your Majesties moft Loyal and Dutifull Subjects.

Great SIR!

WE have lately had intimation of your Majesties Royal Intentions to call a Parliament, and thereby to Enact your Gracious Declaration for Liberty of Confcience into a Law for the Benefit of us and our Pofterity, wherein your Majesty's Princely Care of the Church of England is likewise more repeated to us.

Prayers is therefore, Dread SIR! if we do again prefume to call on your Majesty that we will do our utmoft Endeavour to be your Members to repr'sent us in the ensuing Parliament, and that we will never fear to Declare to be our Bounden Duty under our Common Seal. Rome, May 11. The 7th Instant Cardinal Crenfcorio was feiz'd with an Apoplexy, of which he Died in the Evening in the 81 year of his Age. And the 8th Cardinal Felice Rospigliosi; Nephew of Clement

IX. was taken very ill, who Died the next Morning, being 45 years old; univerfally lamented for his Great and Noble Qualities which had acquired him the esteem of this Court, and of all Europe. There are now by the Death of thefe two Cardinals 8 places vacant in the Sacred Colledge. We have an account from Ferrara that the Town of Lugo, about 15 miles from thence, is quite destroyed by the overflowing of the Po; and that above 8000 People have been Drowned there, and in the Neighbouring Country, with abundance of Cattle.

Warsaw, May 7. The King arriv'd here the 5th Instant from Lithuania. It is not yet certain whether his Majesty will go this Summer to Pruffia. The Sieur Bulniski is sent to Berlin, to finish the Negotiation that was fet on Foot fome Months ago, about the Marriage of Prince James, the Kings Eldest Son, with the young Princefs of Radzeville, Widow of the Marquis Louis of Brandenburg. The Advices from the Frontiers confirm, that the Cham of Tartary is making Preparations to march with a Body of Tartars to join the Ottoman Army in Hungary.

Vienna, May 27. The Imperial Court will return fither from Laxemburg the 5th or 6th of the next month, about which time the Elector of Bavaria is expected here from Munich. We are affured that the Imperial Forces will act in two diftinct Bodies this Campaign; The one, confifting of 36000 men, befides the Troops of Hungary and Croatia, under the Duke of Lorraine; And the other compos'd of the Bavarian Forces and 8 Imperial Regiments, under the Elector of Bavaria; of which laft the Count de Caprara is to be Marfchal de Camp General, the Count de Serim, and the Count de Gondola Lieutenant Generals, and the Counts de Montecuculi and Aspremont Major Generals. Major General Veterani Commands in Transylvania; and Major General Nirelli in Upper Hungary, to fecure thofe Countries againft the Incurfions of the Furks and Tartars, and particularly againft the Garifons of Great Waradin, Gula and Temefwarer. It is confirm'd that the Imperialifts have abandoned Peter Waradin; after having blown up the Fortifications, for that it was a Poft too far advanced, and fo fhut up by the Turks of Illocke, that they were not able to fubfift; And that the 100 German Horfe, with the Heydukes and Huffars that were in Garifon there, were come to Effecke. General Caprara has been to vifit the Fortifications of Eydau and Valkovar, which lie found in a very good Condition; He has given Orders for the repairing the Bridge of Valkovar, which was burnt in two places by the Turks in their Retreat the laft year; It is about 700 Paces in length, and is the only commodious Passage towards Illocke, Mustvozza, Peter Waradin and Begrade. Colonel Corbelli has Orders to poffefs himfelf, with his Troops under his Command, of feveral Pofts in the Neighbourhood of Great Waradin, in order to block up that place. We have Advice by the way of Transylvania, That there have been new Diforders at Conftantinople, occafioned by a Baffa's marching thither with a confiderable Body of men, who demanded to be made Grand Vifer, and was offer'd to be Seraskier of the Morve, but he refufing this, the Grand Signior gave Orders to

the Visier to reduce him by Force, which was attempted and a great deal of Blood spilt, but the final success was not known when these Letters came away. The Duke of *Lorraine* is again very much indisposed.

Bonne, June 4. Yesterday about 4 in the afternoon Died here *Maximilian Henry of Bavaria*, Archbishop of *Cologne*, Elector of the Roman Empire, and Bishop of *Hildesheim*, *Liege* and *Munster*, in the 67 year of his age. He was Grandson of *William* the 5th Duke of *Bavaria*, Great Grand-father of the present Elector of *Bavaria*. His Will will be opened to-morrow; and in the mean time we are told that he hath made the Elector of *Bavaria* his Heir. The Administration of the Government of this Diocess is committed by the Chapter to the Cardinal Coadjutor (who arrived here from *Liege* about an hour after the Electors Death) assisted by two Canons of *Cologne*; and all the Governors of Places, with the Officers both Civil and Military, are to take a new Oath of Fidelity; The like measures it's believed will be taken by the Chapters of *Liege*, *Munster* and *Hildesheim*, who will depute some of their Body to have the superintendance of the publick Affairs, till they have made a new Election.

Brussels, June 8. The Prince and Princes of *Friesland* parted from hence on Sunday last, extremely satisfied with their Reception and Entertainment here. We have an account from *Cadix*, That several French Men of War had been seen off of *Cape St. Vincens*, who came from *Brest* and *Havre de Grace*, and were going to join their Fleet in the *Mediteranean* that's design'd against the *Algerines*. The *Marquess de Risbourg* has received his Commission to be Governor of the Province of *Hainault*.

Marseilles, May 28. The 8 Gallies designed for this Summers Expedition are now at the Islands of this Town, from whence they will part with the first fair Weather for *Ivica* or *Mimorca*, where is appointed the Rendezvous of the Fleet, which it's said will be composed of 30 men of War from *Toulon* and *West-France*, these 8 Gallies, and 10 Galliots carrying Mortars. Their Design, it's now concluded by all, is against *Argiers*. They carry with them about 20000 Bombs, the greatest part of an extraordinary Bigness, being of 4 and 500 weight; And all the *Argier* Commanders and other Officers, that have been taken since the War, are Embarked on the Gallies.

Paris, June 5. The King has had 4 or 5 Fits of a Tertian Ague, but the last, which his Majesty had on *Thursday*, was not so violent as the former. The *Baron de Spanheim*, Envoy Extraordinary of *Brandenburgh*, had the Twenty ninth past Audience of the King to acquaint him with the Death of the late Elector *Frederick William*. The *Prince de Conde* being returned from *Burgundy*, whither he went to hold the States of that Country, all things are now preparing for the Marriage of the *Prince de Conti* with *Mademoiselle de Bourbon*. That between the *Duke de Valentinois*, Son of the *Prince of Monaco*, and *Mademoiselle d'Armagnac* will be likewise very suddenly consummated.

Paris, June 9. The King is better, not having had his Ague since *Thursday* last; His Majesty was yesterday to take the Air at *Trianon*.

Dead, May 30. We have an account by *Capt. Portlock*, who lately arrived in the *Dwina*, That the *Janes Pink* of 8 Guns and 20 Men, *Michael Boulter* Master, being bound for *China* in the Service of the East-India Company, was met on the 14th of *October* last between *Port-Santo* and the *Madrasy* by a *Sally Man* of 14 Guns and 150 Men, who having hailed them, immediately gave them a broad-side, which the *Pink* returned; That the Fight continued with great and small shot till night; That the next Day the *Pink* made the *Sally Man* bring to anchor; And that after several Days Fight (during which the *Pink* lost her Top Mast and Sprit-Sail, had her Main-Yard broke and her Hull and Rigging very much torn) the *Sally Man* seeing their Resolution, clapt his Tacks on board and stood in to the Shore.

Deal, June 1. Yesterday in the Afternoon, and this Morning came into the Downs his Majesties Ships the *Charles Galley*, the *Fersey*, the *Reserve* and the *Constant Warwick*.

London, June 1. At the Sessions held this day at the Old-Baily, there were, among other Malefactors, Four Convicted of High-Treason, for Clipping and Counterfeiting the Current Coin of this Realm; viz. *John Collet* a Blacksmith, late of *Hungerford-Market*, for Coining of several sorts of false Shillings; at one *Buckland's* house in *Red-Lion-Fields*, where *Thomas Baily* and one *Valentine Cogswell* had set up a Coining-Press. *George Emmitt* for Clipping for many years; it appeared he had drawn in many others; that he paid 3l. a Week to two that help'd him to Clip, and paid Rent for three several Houses for that purpose. *Robert Lamborne* a Strong-Waterman, and a Gardiner of *Southwark* for Clipping, who was employed by *Emmitt* at 20 s. a Week. *William Palmer*, a Quack, who had clipped for many years and drawn in several apprentices and others, some whereof have been already convicted. One *Joseph Brown*, for exchanging of broad Money for clip, 25. 6d. a pound advantage, was fined 100 Marks. *Charles Eccleston*, *Mary Hammond*, and *Abigail Gates* alias *Shacknaple*, for uttering of Counterfeit Money, were fined 20 Nobles a piece. *Arabella Reeves* for the same Offence, was fined 20 Marks. And one *Anthony Sanderson* for uttering Counterfeit Money, and 66 false Shillings being taken upon him, was fined 10 Marks.
