The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 3rd March, 1869, whilst the 1st Battalion of the 21st Regiment was disembarking, at Alexandria, from the Egyptian steamer "Bird of the Harbour," one of the soldiers, who was fully accoutred, fell overboard in a fit, and sank immediately.

Captain WILLOUGHBY at once jumped into the water after him, dived, and got hold of him; and after considerable difficulty and danger, saved him. When brought out of the water, the man was insensible.

The harbour of Alexandria is known to be dangerously infested with sharks; but in addition to the danger from sharks, Captain WILLOUGHBY ran great risk from the fact that the soldier fell between the pier and the vessel, and that, owing to the swell in the harbour, both Captain WILLOUGHBY and the soldier might have been crushed.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A DISTRICT, TO BE STYLED THE DISTRICT OF LITTLEBOROUGH, IN THE COUNTY OF LANCASTER, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a Petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the district of Littleborough, in the county of Lancaster, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "Littleborough District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the said Inspector's Report to me, bearing date the 24th day of July, 1869, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the Littleborough District, for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundary commences at the south-west corner of the plan annexed to the report of the Inspector at the point A at Fenslane; thence including such lane, it passes in a

westerly direction along, and including Walmsley-lane and Halliday-lane, to the point B, on the northerly side of the Rochdale, Halifax, and Elland turnpike road; thence northerly along, and including the foot road known as Over the Herods, to the point C, at Lower Starring; thence northerly along, and including the road leading from Lower Starring to Lower Shore, to the point D, on the boundary line between the hamlet of Calderbrook and the township of Wuerdle and Wardle; thence northerly and easterly, following such boundary line to the point E, at High Lee Slack; thence north-easterly along, and including the foot path leading to Hall Hay, to the point F; thence easterly along, and including the foot path leading to Far Hey Head, to the point G; thence easterly along, and including Hey Head-lane, to the point H, on the west side of the road to Hill Barn; thence northerly, along and including the same road to Hill Barn, and along the line of the fence from Hill Barn to and through Stansfield Print Works reservoir, to the fence of the common at the point I; thence easterly and north-easterly, along the line of the fence of the common to the point J; thence northerly, along the line of the fence of the common to point K, at Pike Hill; thence easterly, along the line of the fence of the common, and including Pike Delph, to the point L; thence northerly, along and including the road leading from Pike Delph to Dog Hills, at the point M; thence southerly, along and including Wilmer's-lane, to the point N, on the easterly side of the turnpike road leading from Littleborough to Todmorden; thence southerly and easterly, along and including the said turnpike road, and the road leading to the north end of the Chelburn reservoir bank to the point O; thence southerly round, and including Chelburn Reservoir, and along the overflow course from Chelburn Reservoir to Snoddle Hill Reservoir, and including such reservoir, to the point P; thence along the easterly boundary fence of that part of Long Lee Hey Farm, which adjoins the footpath leading from Leach's and following and including such footpath to the point Q, at Castle Clough; thence southerly, following the line of the fence of Blackstone Edge Moor to the point R, on the northerly side of the Rochdale, Halifax, and Elland Turnpike-road; thence south-easterly along and including such last-mentioned turnpike-road to the point S, on such road; thence crossing such road southerly, and including the Old Blackstone Edge Road to Rough, and following and including Rough-lane, to the point T on the boundary line separating the hamlet of Blatchinworth from the township of Butterworth; thence westerly, and following such boundary line to the point U, where the boundary line meets Hollingworth Brook; thence southerly, along and including such brook to the footpath leading to Hollingworth Bank at the point V; thence southerly, and including such footpath, to the point W, on Hollingworth Bank; thence westerly, along and including the road on the northerly side of Hollingworth Reservoir to Fen's-lane; and along and including such lane to the starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the proposed district of Littleborough.

2. That Mr. Henry Travis the younger, Woollen Manufacturer, of Handle Cottage, Littleborough, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the hereinbefore recited Local Government Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said district of Littleborough, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and

settled by this present Order. And in case of the failure or inability of the said Henry Travis to discharge such duty of Summoning Officer, that Mr. William Alexander Graves, of Kershaw Heys, Littleborough, Gentleman, act in his stead.

Light Vessel on Schultz Ground.

THE Danish Government has given notice, that in the month of October, 1869, a light vessel exhibiting two lights will be placed in a south-westerly direction from Schultz Ground at the entrance to the Belts.
