**A**T the Court at *Windsor*, the 9th day of *July*, 1869.

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the county of the town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, which is hereinafter mentioned and described (such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas certain tithe rent charges arising within the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, have become vested in us, under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts, or of some

of them, and we have, in respect of such tithe rent charges, agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act, to the incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as an incumbent thereof shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act, and to his successors, a grant of two hundred pounds per annum; and also a further grant of one hundred pounds per annum, so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district, and shall have been approved by us, and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district.

"And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be secured by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that all that part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and which is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthew, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.'

And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The **SCHEDULE** to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthew, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, being—

"All that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the county of the town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and in the diocese of Durham, which is bounded on the north partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Andrew, Newcastle-upon-Tyne,

and partly by the district of Saint Philip, High Elswick, on the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint Paul, High Elswick, and partly by the district chapelry of Saint Stephen, Low Elswick, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and on the remaining side that is to say, on the east by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Saint Stephen, Low Elswick, from the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne aforesaid, at the point where Hindestreet and Ord-street are joined by the street or road called or known as Ord-terrace; and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street or road to its junction with George-street; and extending thence, north-westward, along the middle of the last-named-street, to its junction with Blandford-street; and extending thence, north-eastward, along the middle of the last-named street, to its junction with the street or road called or known as Westgate-hill; and extending thence, south-eastward, along the middle of the last-named street or road, and along the middle of the street or road called or known as Westgate, to the junction of the last-named street or road with Bath-lane; and extending thence, north-westward, along the middle of the said lane, to the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, from the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Andrew, Newcastle-upon-Tyne aforesaid."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas one calendar month has elapsed since a draft of the said scheme was so transmitted as aforesaid and no objections to the said scheme have been made by the patron or by the incumbent of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint John, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

*Board of Trade, Whitehall,

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, inclosing copy of a Decree of the Spanish Government abolishing the monopoly on salt.

The following are the Articles of the Decree:—

(Translation.)

ART. 1. On and after the 1st of January, 1870, the elaboration and sale of salt shall be entirely free, and the State monopoly now existing shall consequently disappear.

All owners of salt factories receiving indemnification from, or having their factories rendered actually useless by, the State, either by virtue of the payment of settled duties, or by the price raised by the exclusive purchase of the article, will cease to receive the sums which on these accounts they are in the habit of doing under any title whatsoever, from the day that, within the second half of the financial year of 1869-70, the executive power in each case shall appoint, for the re-occupation by the said proprietors of their salt works, in virtue of the liquidation and payment of the value of the erections, machines and improvements which the Finance Department may have made in them. The surplus of salt shall be alienated by the Finance Department in the most convenient manner.

ART. 2. On the declaration of free elaboration and sale no right of indemnification is recognized to those corporations or individuals interested in the collection of taxes or charges on the consumption of salt as long as they do not support by a legal and original title an onerous contract by which the State is bound to pay such tax or charge.

ART. 3. The salt works of the Finance Department are declared to be for sale, as well as the other possessions and effects belonging to the same, which are employed exclusively for the service of the revenue. The payment of the salt works sold will be effected in bullion, the buyers handing over the tenth part on the verification of the adjudication, and the remainder by equal parts in the nine following years. The sale will take place by public auction. The salt works of Torre Vieja, Imon, and Alfaques are excepted from the present sale.

ART. 4. The Government will take care to provide the deposits and storehouses with the ordinary stock, augmenting by 20 per cent. the consignment decreed in all the non-saliferous parts

of Spain, during the second half of the financial year.

From the 1st of July, 1870 it will proceed to the sale of the surplus resulting without further provisions. The Executive Power will maintain or lower the prices in accordance with the state of the market, until the said date of July 1st, 1870.

ART. 5. The Finance Department will compete with private individuals at the sale, both wholesale and retail, of all the salt belonging to the State in those salt works of which it shall retain the management, the terms of sale being settled by the market price.

ART. 6. The importation of foreign salt will be free at the Spanish Custom Houses from the 1st of January, 1870, subject to the payment of 13 reals per metric quintal.

The coasting trade of native salt will be subject to no Customs dues.

The exportation of salt in foreign or native bottoms will be perfectly free, of whatever tonnage the ships may be.

ART. 7. The proprietors of salt works, mines, or evaporating pans will pay duty according to the territorial extent of what they work.

ART. 8. Those who shall devote themselves either to the wholesale or retail sale of salt, shall be included in the lists of the industrial contributions, it being the duty of the Executive Power to fix the quotas temporarily, without prejudice to modifications in an upward or downward sense according as experience may counsel.

ART. 9. The Executive Power will adopt all necessary means for facilitating the change in the salt traffic from a monopoly to open trade, without endangering the supply of this very necessary article during the action of the budget in those parts of the Peninsula which may be without it. In accordance with the Cortes this is communicated to the Executive Power for its fulfilment and publication as law.

#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A DISTRICT, TO BE STYLED THE DISTRICT OF MILNROW, IN THE COUNTY OF LANCASTER, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a Petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the district of Milnrow, in the county of Lancaster, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "Milnrow District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the said Inspector's Report to me, bearing date the 29th day of July, 1869, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the Milnrow District, for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundary commences at the point A, at the south-west corner of the map annexed to the Report of the Inspector, at Knot Booth, where the boundaries of the parliamentary borough of Oldham, and of the townships of Castleton and Butterworth, respectively meet; thence in a northerly direction along the boundary line between the

townships of Castleton and Butterworth to the point B, at the Rochdale Canal, on the boundary line between the parliamentary borough of Rochdale and the township of Butterworth; thence northerly, and following such last-named boundary line to the point C, at the River Beal; thence south-easterly, along the boundary line dividing the hamlet of Clegg from the hamlet of Belfield to the point D, where the boundaries of the hamlets of Clegg, Belfield, Wildhouse and Lowhouse respectively meet; thence south-easterly and northerly, following the boundary line which separates the hamlet of Wildhouse from the hamlet of Low House to the point E; thence along the south-westerly boundary fence of Lower Crownest Wood, and along the southerly side of the lane leading to Crownest Farm to the point F; thence around and including the farmhouse and messuage at Crow Nest; and along the easterly side of the lane leading from such farmhouse to the trough near Flash House, at the point G; thence north-easterly along, and including Bell-lane, and the lane leading to Higher Crow Nest Farm to the point H, where the boundary line, separating the hamlet of Low House from the hamlet of Bleaked Gate-cum-Rough Bank, respectively meet at Higher Crow Nest; thence southerly, along the line separating the hamlet of Bleaked Gate-cum-Rough Bank from the hamlet of Butterworth Hall to the point I, at the junction of the hamlets of Bleaked Gate-cum-Rough Bank, Butterworth Hall, and Haugh, respectively, at or near Walk Mill Wood; thence around, and including the entire hamlet of Haugh to the point K, where the boundary of such last named hamlet joins the boundary line of the parliamentary borough of Oldham, at or near Ellen-road; thence westerly, along such last named parliamentary borough boundary line, to the starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the proposed district of Milnrow.

2. That Mr. James Whitworth, Fulling Miller, of Milnrow, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the hereinbefore recited Local Government Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said district of Milnrow, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this present Order.
