

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Arlington, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those annual tithe commutation rent charges, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said tithe commutation rent charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors, for ever: Provided always, that such tithe commutation rent charges, so granted and conveyed by us as aforesaid, shall be, and be held to be, in lieu of; and in full substitution for, certain annual stipends, together amounting to one hundred and nine pounds six shillings and two pence, heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage, in respect of certain property formerly belonging to the Prebend of Woodhorne, and shall be, and be held to be, also in lieu of, and in full substitution for, the annual grant of five pounds, heretofore payable by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, out of our common fund, under and by virtue of a certain Order of Her Majesty in Council, which was published in the London Gazette of the sixteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one: And provided also, that such tithe commutation rent charges shall be, and be held to be, charged and chargeable at all times for ever hereafter, in exoneration of all other property whatsoever, now or formerly belonging to the said Prebend of Woodhorne, with the liability to repair and maintain the chancel of the church of the said parish of Arlington: And provided further, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said tithe commutation rent charges, as from the first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a yearly rent charge of fifty pounds, which has been permanently secured to the vicarage of Portisham, in the county of Dorset, and in the diocese of Salisbury, and of a further benefaction of three hundred and fifty pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the said vicarage, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, and his successors, an annual sum of eleven pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and

thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Portisham, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments
