Revolving Light on Cape Ferro.

THE Governor-General of Algeria has given Notice, that on and after the 15th day of August, 1869, a new light would be exhibited on Cape Ferro (Ras Hadid), in the province of Constantine, Algeria.

The light is a *revolving* light, showing alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of thirty seconds, from an elevation of 218 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse of stone stands on a building near the extremity of the Cape, and the position, as given, is in lat. $37^{\circ} 4' 47''$ N., long. $7^{\circ} 11' 46''$ East of Greenwich.

(No. 61.)—NEW ZEALAND—COOK STRAIT—MIDDLE ISLAND.

Revolving Light on Farewell Spit.

THE Colonial Government has given notice, that a lighthouse is to be erected in the immediate vicinity of Bush End, on Farewell Spit, at the western entrance of Cook Strait.

The intended light is to be a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute; but a red sector will be shown over the Spit end, in order to caution Mariners of their approach to that danger.

The illuminating apparatus is to be dioptric, or by lenses, of the second order.

The light-tower is to be an open-framed structure of wood, 118 feet high, and the light, which will be exhibited from an elevation about 120 feet above the sea level, should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 17 miles. Approximate position, lat. $40^{\circ} 33' 20''$ S., long. $173^{\circ} 1' 50''$ E.

Revolving Light on Cape Campbell.

Also, that a lighthouse is to be erected on a knoll at the northern extreme of the high land of Cape Campbell, on the south side of the eastern entrance to Cook Strait.

The intended light is to be a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy once every

minute, and will be seen all round, except when intercepted by the land. It will be exhibited from an elevation about 155 feet above the sea level, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is to be dioptric, or by lenses, of the second order.

The light-tower is to be an open-framed structure of wood, and will be about 73 feet high, from base to top of lantern. Approximate position lat. $41^{\circ} 43' 30''$ S., long. $174^{\circ} 18' 25''$ E.

MIDDLE ISLAND—MOLYNEUX BAY.

Fixed Light on Nugget Point.

Also, that a lighthouse is to be erected on a well-defined knoll, about 240 feet high, at the outer extremity of Nugget point, the southern limit of Molyneux bay, in lat. $46^{\circ} 27'$ S., long. $169^{\circ} 51'$ East of Greenwich.

The intended light will be a *fixed* white light. It will show to seaward over an arc of about 225° ; will be exhibited from an elevation of 252 feet above the sea level, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 23 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is to be dioptric, or by lenses, of the first order.

The light-tower will be of stone, painted white to suit the background, and will be 31 feet in height from base to top of lantern.

NORTH ISLAND—WEST COAST.

Fixed Light at Manakau Heads.

It is intended to exhibit from one of the beacons on the South head of Manakau harbour, a *fixed* white light, and though only of moderate power, may, from its great elevation above the sea, about 500 feet, be seen in an exceptionally clear state of the atmosphere, from a distance of 30 miles.

Caution.—This light is only meant to benefit vessels accustomed to trade along the coast. It is not intended in any way to encourage vessels to attempt to enter Manakau harbour during the night, nor is it meant to encourage strangers to approach the coast.

It is anticipated that the intended lights described above, will be lighted early in 1870; but more exact and detailed descriptions will be published when the are more advanced.

Existence of Beaver Reef confirmed.

THE following additional information relative to Beaver reef, an outlying danger off Swan river, already reported in Hydrographic Notice, No. 10, dated 25th May, 1868, has been received

from the Surveyor General's Department, Western Australia.

The existence of the Beaver reef, which was reported to have been seen in 1864, has been confirmed by Captain Laing of the Schooner *Giff*, who passed it on the 15th of April, 1869, when the sea was breaking heavily and continuously on the danger.

The reef appeared to extend about half a mile North and South; soundings were obtained in 15 to 18 fathoms, a quarter of a mile from the southern end, and its position agreed with that assigned to it in the above Hydrographic Notice, viz., about 52 miles, W. by S. (true) from the west end of Rottneest island, or in lat. $32^{\circ} 8'$ S., long. $114^{\circ} 32'$ E., approximately.

INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 28th year of Her Majesty, cap. 30, for granting to Her Majesty certain duties of Customs and Inland Revenue, power is given for increasing in certain cases the number of persons appointed under the provisions made by the Act passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty, cap. 35, Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax Acts, and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each district or division in Great Britain; and it appearing to the Board of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so appointed for the division of Wincanton, in the county of Somerset, is insufficient for the proper discharge of the business therein arising under the Income Tax Act, the said Board hereby authorise the increase in the number of the Commissioners for the said division to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen; and we, the undersigned, two members of the said Board, do hereby convene a meeting of the persons appointed for putting in execution within the said county an Act passed in the 38th year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the service of the year 1798," being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners in the execution of the last-mentioned Act, to be holden at the Townhall, in Wincanton, on Monday, the 27th day of September, 1869, at twelve o'clock at noon, for the purpose of choosing and appointing, according to the regulations of the said Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty, such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for general purposes for the said district of Wincanton, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding four-

teen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen.
