SEA COAST BETWEEN THE NORTHERN-MOST BOUNDARY OF THE PARISH OF HORNSEA AND SPURN POINT.

REMOVAL OF SHINGLE PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the 54 Geo. III., cap. 159, sec. 14, that "in order to prevent damage being done to the shores or banks of the ports, harbours, or havens in this kingdom, no person or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks, or any portion of the shores or banks of any port, harbour, or haven of this kingdom, from which the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom for the time being shall find it necessary, for the protection of such port, harbour, or haven, or the works thereof, by Order under their hands, or the hands of any three of them, or the hands of his or their Secretary, and published in the London Gazette, shall prohibit the taking or removing of such shingle or ballast, upon pain of forfeiting for every such offence the sum of ten pounds:"

And whereas it is further enacted by "The Harbours Transfer Act, 1862" (25 and 26 Victoria, cap. 69, sec. 16), "that from and after the 31st day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, sections fourteen and sixteen of the Act of the fifty-fourth year of King George the Third (chapter one hundred and fifty-nine), 'for the better regulation of the several ports, harbours, roadsteads, sounds, channels, bays, and navigable rivers in the United Kingdom, and of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, arsenals, wharfs, moorings, and stores thereon, and for repealing several Acts passed for that purpose,' and all provisions in the said Act contained relative thereto, shall be read and construed as if the Board of Trade were named in the said sections instead of the Admiralty:"

And whereas the Board of Trade have found it necessary, for the protection of the harbour or haven of the River Humber, and of the shores and banks thereof, and of the works thereof, to prohibit, by Order dated the 1st of August, 1868, the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or bank of the said harbour or haven of the River Humber:

And whereas for the further protection of the said harbour, haven, or port, and also for the protection of the shores and banks of the port of Kingston-upon-Hull, and of the works thereof, the Board of Trade have found it necessary to extend the limits mentioned in said Order:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, under the hand of their Secretary, prohibit all persons from taking or removing any description of shingle or ballast from the shore or banks,

or from any portion of the shore or banks of the said harbour or haven, or from the shores and banks of the port of Kingston-upon-Hull, and the works thereof, between the northernmost boundary of the parish of Hornsea and the limits north of Spurn Point defined by said Order of the 1st of August, 1868.

CROMWELL ROAD, South, Kensington.	Three Carriages. To commence at the lamp post nearest the point of the triangular piece of ground at the junction of Cromwell Road and Old Brompton Road, and extend along the kerbstone Westward as far as necessary for three hackney carriages to stand.
PRINCE ALBERT ROAD ...	Seven Carriages. Commencing at a gully hole on the East side of Prince Albert Road, opposite No. 35, and extend Southward as far as necessary for seven hackney carriages to stand.
KENSINGTON ROAD	Twelve Carriages. CHANDOS STREET, Cavendish Square.	Six Carriages. To commence at the lamp post four feet South of the house No. 11, and extend along the kerb on the East side of the said street as far as necessary for six hackney carriages to stand, horses' heads towards the North.
LANGHAM PLACE, Regent Street.	Twenty-one Carriages. BINFIELD ROAD, Clapham Road.	Five Carriages. To commence twenty yards from the paved crossing at the East end of Binfield Road, and extend along the centre of the same as far as necessary for five hackney carriages to stand.
STOCKWELL PLACE, Brixton.	Five Carriages. To commence at the corner of the "Swan" Public House and extend along the kerbstone Eastward thirty yards, keeping clear of the entrance to the mews at the rear of the "Swan" Public House.
