THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of the new Spanish Customs' Tariff, which came into force on the first ult., together with a copy of the Decree to which it is annexed.

*Ministry of Finance.*

**DECREE.**

AS REGENT OF THE KINGDOM, acquiescing in the proposition of the Minister of Finance, and in accordance with the Council of Ministers I have thought fit to decree the following:—

ART. 1. The Customs' Tariffs annexed to this Decree, drawn up in fulfilment of Art. 9 of the Budget of Ways and Means dated 1st inst., and in accordance with the bases laid down for that purpose in appendix "Letter C," are hereby approved.

ART. 2. Those Tariffs shall come into force in all the Custom Houses in the kingdom on 1st August next, and the duties mentioned therein shall be charged on all goods examined, on and after that day.

ART. 3. Any special complaints arising from the immediate application of the new duties shall be decided by the General Direction of Revenue, from which there shall be appeal to the Ministry of Finance.

ART. 4. According to basis 5 the duties assigned to each article shall not be altered during the six years between 1st instant and 1st July, 1875.

In the six years immediately following the extraordinary duties shall be lowered until they are reduced to 15 per cent.

In making these reductions the following rules shall be observed:—

1. Duties exceeding 15 per cent. and under 20 per cent. shall be reduced to 15 per cent. on 1st July, 1875, when the first six years conclude.

2. The other extraordinary duties of 20 per cent. and upwards shall be reduced to 15 per cent. by reductions of one third at a time, the first to be made on 1st July, 1875, the second on 1st July, 1878, and the third and last on 1st July, 1881.

3. The duties fixed for the rest of the articles of 15 per cent. or under, and those which are placed on articles which can bear the extra duty now imposed on them by reason of their high price or general consumption according to basis 4, shall at the said time (1st July, 1875), be reduced or not as it may then appear convenient.

The items corresponding to each of these groups shall be marked in the Tariff with distinguishing signs.

ART. 5. The premium of 13 escudos 40 milesimas per ton now granted by rule 31 of the Tariff to persons building ships of more than 368 metrical tons shall continue to be paid, and according to Art. 13 of the Decree of 22nd November, 1868, the duties on shipbuilding materials imported from abroad shall also be returned to the builders of ships of no matter what dimensions.

ART. 6. At the commencement of the forthcoming legislature the Government will present

to the Cortes a project of law, in which will be proposed:

1. To change the restitution of duties, spoken of in the previous Article, into an increase of the premium on construction.

2. To grant a premium to constructors of machines.

3. To commute according to paragraph 2 of Art. 18 of the budget law of 25th June, 1864, the freedom from duty, of materials applicable to railroads into a fixed sum, to be considered as an additional subvention.

ART. 7. The premium of 6 escudos 955 milesimas per 100 kilos. of sugar refined in the Peninsular now granted by the laws to the exporters of such sugar shall continue to be paid.

ART. 8. The actual Customs ordinances with the orders modifying them shall continue in force until within a short time others shall be drawn up, according to basis 12 of the aforesaid appendix "Letter C."

ART. 9. The Custom Houses now established shall also continue open.

ART. 10. The general and special depôts now in existence shall also continue, and shall admit all merchandize (except those which only pay weighing duty on their admission to the kingdom) and articles of monopoly.

ART. 11. The Valuation Committee, created by basis 10, shall be composed of the following persons:—

1. The Director-General of Revenue, President.

2. Two Members of the Board of Customs Tariffs, who shall be named by the Minister of Finance, and shall be the same for all the classes of the tariff.

3. Merchants, manufacturers, or persons expert in the different branches, whom the Minister of Finance may think fit to name for each one of the said classes.

4. The Secretary of the Board of Customs Tariffs, who shall be Secretary of the Committee, without a vote.

The valuation statistics of each year shall be published in the first quarter of the following one.

ART. 12. For the fulfilment of basis 14, concerning the organization of the Customs employés, a Committee is created, to be composed of the following persons:—

1. The Director-General of Revenue, President.

2. Three Members chosen by the Minister of Finance from among the persons who may have held high administrative positions, or who may be Deputies.

3. The Secretary of the Direction, who shall be Secretary of the Committee, with a vote.

ART. 13. All laws and dispositions concerning Customs Tariffs, not expressly mentioned in this Decree, or in the special dispositions preceding the tariff published this day, are hereby abrogated.

DISPOSITIONS FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE CUSTOMS TARIFF.

DISPOSITION 1.

Articles free of Duty.

The following articles shall pay no duty whatever on their importation into the Peninsula and Balearic Islands :—

1. Mineral waters (exclusive of the bottles, &c.).
2. Trees, vine shoots, and plants.
3. (Protoxide of lime).
4. Collectons of herbs or plants, scientifically arranged.
5. Minerals, whether loose or in collections, for the purposes of study.
6. Copper ore.
7. Gold ore.
8. Silver ore.
9. Specimens in small pieces of any kind.
10. Patterns of woven goods, in pieces large enough to admit of the pattern being seen.
11. Archæological and numismatic objects.
12. Gold, silver, and platinum, in jewels and plate rendered useless, bars, coin, pieces, dust, and plates.
13. Gold, silver, and platinum articles, finished and proved in Spain.
14. Pearls, common ditto, and precious stones.
15. Silk in the pod, refuse of the pods, and silk-worms' eggs.
16. Gypsum (sulphate of lime).
17. Clothes, objects of cleanliness and comfort, bed and table linen, books, tools, portable instruments, theatrical costumes, jewels and plate, which, bearing unmistakable marks of having been used, may be brought by travellers in their luggage, in quantities proportionate to their station, profession, and circumstances.

DISPOSITION 2.

Articles free of duty, after the fulfilment of the formalities hereinafter mentioned.

1. Packing cases imported, for the exportation of national merchandize.  
But the person must lodge a sum equal to the tariff dues, and re-export the packing cases within the precise term of three months.  
In the documents drawn up on entry shall be set forth the number, kind, and size of the cases, which shall be compared on exportation.
2. National wines and cases returned from abroad, if, in the documents of entry, be expressed the number, kind, and size of the cases, and the quantity and class of the wines, as well as the number and date of the export bill of lading.
3. Barrels, sacks, and large covers of metal, imported with goods, when the parties interested re-export them within three months, and with the intervention of the Custom House.
4. Coral gathered by Spaniards, and brought directly in a national vessel, when this can be proved.
5. Fine art works, executed by Spaniards abroad, and those bought by the Government, Academies, or other Corporations, for museums, galleries, or studios, when these circumstances are proved.
6. Rosaries, sanctuaries, and other similar objects from the Holy Places.
7. Carriages, cattle, trained animals, collections of wax figures and other similar collections, if the owners guarantee the payment of the dues in case the things are not re-exported within six months, and if on re-exportation it is proved that they are the same articles which where imported.
8. Spanish carriages and cattle returning from abroad; but a detailed description, and the fact

that they will be reimported within six months, must be set forth in the export documents.

9. Spanish books returning from abroad, when, in the export documents, mention is made of the number of copies, title of the work, and name of the printer.

Should the regulations laid down for each case not be complied with, or should complete conformity not result from the examinations and verifications, the concession shall be annulled, and the Customs Administrators shall levy the corresponding Tariff dues.

National articles and goods returned from foreign exhibitions; furniture, luggage, carriages, and effects of the diplomatic body, and the furniture of Spaniards resident abroad, or of foreigners coming to establish themselves in Spain, shall also be free from duty, the Customs Administrations and the parties interested being subject to the rules laid down on the subject in the ordinances and special instructions.

DISPOSITION 3.

Differential Dues.

No differential dues shall be levied on articles imported in foreign ships or by land; except the following goods which shall pay the dues expressed below, until 1st January, 1872.

DISPOSITION 4.

*Special Duties.*

1. Cotton, unclesaned, shall pay the half of the duties fixed in Division 104.
2. Rice in the husk shall pay the half of the duties fixed in Division 236.
3. Flour shall pay the duty on the grains from which it is made, plus 50 per cent.
4. Ready made clothes shall pay on their total weight the duty fixed for the fabric of which they are made externally, plus 50 per cent.
5. Stuffs embroidered by hand or by machinery, and those with a mixture of real or spurious metal, shall pay the duty on the kind of woven goods to which they belong, plus 50 per cent.
6. Woven goods of thread, wool, or silk, containing a mixture of cotton in one part only of the woof or warp, shall pay as if made of unmixed thread, wool, or silk.
7. Woven goods of wool and silk, or faced with silk, the woof or warp of which is of one of these two substances, shall pay for one fifth of the weight as silk, and for four fifths as wool.
8. Woven goods of thread and silk, the woof or warp of which is of one of these two substances, and goods of cotton and silk, the woof or warp of which is wholly of cotton, shall pay for four fifths of the weight as woven goods of thread or cotton respectively; and for one fifth as silk. Plush and velvet are excepted. These shall pay for three fifths as cotton, and for two fifths as silk.
9. Woven goods of thread and wool, the woof or warp of which is of one of these two substances, shall pay for three fifths of the weight as wool, and for two fifths as linen.
10. Woven goods of thread and cotton, the woof or warp of which is all cotton, shall pay for half the weight as cotton, and for the other half as linen.
11. Woven goods which, having all the woof or warp of thread, wool, silk, or cotton, may contain in the other part of the fabric (woof or warp as the case may be) two or more of the above substances, shall pay according to the foregoing rules, being considered as made of thread, wool, silk, or cotton, &c., as to the mixture, of the substance which pays the lowest duties.

DISPOSITION 5.

*Packing Cases.*

Articles chargeable with weighing dues, oils, greases, meats, fish, &c., and all those articles which cannot be separated from the case without deterioration, or without part of the merchandize adhering thereto, shall pay for the gross weight, that is to say, including the case.

All other articles shall pay including the weight of the inside, but not of the outside cases, which shall be charged for separately.

Pipes and barrels which may be afterwards used for holding liquids, and large metal covers which may serve for holding goods, other than those which may have come in them, shall pay the corresponding dues.

Sacks shall pay 10 centimes of a peseta each.

By "outside case" is meant the case visible when the package is closed. All those within this are inside cases.

DISPOSITION 6.

*Tare.*

The following percentage shall be taken as tare, from the gross weight of the goods mentioned below—

DISPOSITION 7.

*Ad valorem Duties.*

In ad valorem payments, the parties interested shall set forth in the declarations the value of the goods. If the employés, charged with the despatch thereof, think the goods to be undervalued, and the interested parties do not agree to the value fixed by the employés, the Administration shall name a skilled person who, with one chosen by the interested party and another by the Board of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, shall decide as to the exact value.

The skilled persons shall, if possible, be chosen from among the merchants or manufacturers of the goods to be valued.

In towns where there is no Board of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, the third skilled person shall be named by the Alcalde.

DISPOSITION 8.

*Exportation and Reimportation.*

The goods not enumerated in the Export Tariff shall be exported in entire freedom from duty.

Produce, goods, and effects exported to the Spanish colonies shall be free from duty on their return to the Peninsula, if it is proved that they are the same which were exported.

National produce, goods, and effects, exported to foreign countries and returned to the Peninsula, shall be considered as foreign, and shall pay the duties fixed in the Import Tariff. The goods included in Disposition 2 are excepted.

By "silvery lead or litharge," is meant metal containing more than 30 grains of silver for every 100 kilos. of lead.

DISPOSITION 9.

*Commerce with the Canary Islands.*

The ports of Santa Cruz de Tenerife, Orotava, Ciudad del Real de las Palmas, Santa Cruz de la

Palma, Arrecife de Lanzarote, Puerto de Cabras, and San Sebastian, in the Canary Islands, are the only ports which may trade with those of the Peninsula.

The following articles will be admitted as the national produce of those Islands.

Goods, produce, and effects, re-exported from the Canaries as unsaleable, or for other reasons, shall lose their nationality.

Goods coming from the Spanish colonies, and touching at the Canaries, shall preserve their nationality on their introduction into the Peninsula, the said ports being considered as depôts, but the register must be made in conformity with that which is established for foreign goods.

#### DISPOSITION 10.

##### *Commerce with the Spanish Provinces in America.*

Goods, being the produce of, and coming from these provinces, and having no duty marked for them in the Tariff as such, shall pay the half of the duties fixed for similar foreign goods.

#### DISPOSITION 11.

##### *Commerce with the Spanish Provinces in Oceania.*

Goods being the produce of, and coming from these provinces, shall pay a fifth part of the dues fixed for similar foreign goods.

#### DISPOSITION 12.

##### *Commerce with Fernando Po.*

Goods, being the produce of, and coming directly from the Spanish Islands of Fernando Po and its dependencies, Annobon, Corisco, Elobey, and Cabo de San Juan, shall pay no duty on their importation into the Peninsula, the commerce between the Peninsula and those places being classed as coasting trade.

All produce of the West Coast of Africa, brought to the said Islands, and from thence carried

straight to the Peninsula, shall pay three fifths of the dues fixed in the tariff, if the said goods are included in the documents, prescribed by the Customs ordinances.

#### DISPOSITION 13.

The following articles cannot be introduced into the Kingdom.

1. Arms and munitions of war purposes, except with the permission of the Government.
2. Hydrographic Charts, published by the Depôt of Marine.
3. Maps and plans made by Spaniards still holding their copyright, unless by permission of the same.
4. Books and printed papers in Spanish, in the cases laid down in the law of copyright.
5. Missals, breviaries, books of daily prayer, and other books of the liturgy of the Catholic Church.
6. Pictures, figures, or any other objects offensive to morality.
7. Pharmaceutical preparations, or secret remedies, the component parts of which cannot be discovered, or the receipt for making which may not have been published.
8. Common salt, up to 1st January, 1870, after which date the duty mentioned in item 86 of the Tariff shall come into force.
9. Tobacco, in the manner and cases prescribed by the regulations of its monopoly.

#### NOTICES.

1. The items in the Tariff, the present duties on which exceed 15 per cent., without reaching 20 per cent., and are to be reduced to 15 per cent. on 1st July, 1875, are marked with the letter (a).
2. Those now paying 20 per cent. or more, and reducible by third parts from 1st July, 1875, until they reach 15 per cent. on 1st July, 1881, are marked with the letter (b).
3. All the other unmarked items, whether bearing extraordinary or fiscal dues, may, after 1st July, 1875, be reduced or not, according as it may then appear desirable.
4. The items marked with an asterisk pay weighing dues.

The duties have been marked in escudos and pesetas, bearing in mind that, according to the Decree of the Provisional Government of 19th October, 1868, and to the Order of the Executive Power of 23rd March last, the use of the new monetary system is obligatory after 1st January, 1871. In the meantime, the Custom Houses shall be managed under the present system of escudos and milesimas.

In the reduction of escudos and milesimas to pesetas and centimes, care has been taken to make the latter end always in 0 or 5, for the simplifying of calculation.
