Board of Trade, Whitehall, September 20, 1869.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, a copy of an Order issued by the Spanish Government on the 2nd instant, relative to the importation of cereals into Spain.

This Order allows vessels with a cargo of wheat, flour, and other cereals included in divisions 237 and 238 of the Tariff which came into operation on the 1st ultimo (i.e. oats, millet, buckwheat, barley, rye, and Indian corn), to discharge at one or at several Custom-houses, in conformity with the directions contained in Art. 13 of the Ordinances at present in force, with regard to other merchandize.

Vessels may also pursue their voyage to foreign parts with the whole of their cargo, their registry being cancelled in the Custom-house where the declaration has been made, according to the regu-

lations contained in Art. 8 of the above-mentioned Ordinances, relative to stock fish coming from the fisheries.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the fist which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 16th day of September, 1869.

Notice of Adoption of Acts by Drighlington, in the County of York.

WHEREAS a Meeting of the Local Board for the township of Drighlington, in the county of York, acting under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, adopted, on the 12th day of July, 1869, the Public House Closing Acts, 1864 and 1865, within that district, and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secre-

taries of State, as required by the said last hereinbefore recited Acts.

Now, therefore, I do hereby give notice, that such Acts have been duly adopted within the limits of the district of the said Local Board, and that, in accordance with the provisions of the said Public House Closing Acts, those Acts have the force of law within the said district, from and after the expiration of one month from the date of the passing of the resolution, adopting the said Acts in such township of Drighlington.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF A DISTRICT, TO BE STYLED THE DISTRICT OF DOEKING TOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF SURREY, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from ratepayers resident within the district of Dorking Town, in the county of Surrey, praying me to settle and fix the boundaries of a district to be styled the "Dorking Town District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been duly made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the said Inspector's Report to me, bearing date the 8th day of September, 1869, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the "Dorking Town District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The boundary line commences on the map accompanying the Report of the Inspector at the point A, which is taken to be at Mrs. Mayo's Lodge, and on the east side of the turnpike-road, leading from Leatherhead to Dorking, thence the line passes in an easterly and southerly direction along the easterly boundary of the property of the late John Mathew, Esq., to the point B, on the easterly side of the River Mole, thence southerly along and including that river, to the point C, thence crossing such river in a straight line westerly and along the boundary fence of the property of Martin Leslie Leslie, Esq., to the point D, on the easterly side of Old Pixham-lane,

thence southerly along and including that lane, and Punch Bowl-lane, to the point E, at the foot-path leading to Park-farm, thence south-westerly along certain fences on the property of Mrs. Hope, and numbered 2312 and 2305 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the bridge crossing the public highway, called Chart-lane, at the point F, thence southerly along and including such last-mentioned lane, to the point G, thence crossing such lane and easterly along certain fences, on the property of Mrs. Hope, and numbered 2262, 2261, and 2284A, on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the point H, at the clump of Fir Trees on the summit of the Glory Hill, thence westerly along the boundary fence which separates the properties of the late John Mathew, Esq., and John Deverell, Esq., and along the southerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 1420, 1421, 1423, and 1401, on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the point I, thence northerly along the westerly boundary fence of such last-named property, and crossing Cold Harbour-lane, to the point J, on the north side of that lane, thence north-easterly along and including Cold Harbour-lane, to the point K, thence westerly along the south boundary of the Nower which is numbered 1321 on the tithe map, and northerly along the westerly boundary fences of such lastnamed property and of those numbered 1318 and 1317 on the tithe map, to the point L, thence westerly along the northern boundary fence of the property of Arthur Kett Barclay, Esq., to the point M, on the west side of the stream known as Milton Brook, thence northerly along and including such brook and the pond of Milton Mill, and following and including the stream known as the Pipp Brook, to the point N, thence northerly and easterly along the westerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 825 and 826 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, and crossing the Reading, Guildford, and Reigate Railway, to the point O, on the north side of such railway, thence in an easterly direction, along and including such railway, to the point P, thence northerly, along the westerly boundary fence of the property numbered 697 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the point Q, on the north side of the road leading from Ranmore, thence easterly, along and including that road and the road leading to the lime pits, to the point R, at the north west corner of the property numbered 740 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, thence easterly, along the northerly and easterly boundary fences of such last named property, and the northerly boundary fences of the properties numbered 735, 733, 744, 745, 746, 747, and 750 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the point S, on the westerly side of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway, thence northerly, along and including such railway, to the point T, thence easterly, crossing such railway and following the northerly boundary fence of the property numbered 750 on the tithe map of Dorking parish, to the starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the proposed town district of Dorking.

2. That Mr. Frederick Durant, Chemist and Druggist, Dorking, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary under the hereinbefore recited Local Government Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said Town District of Dorking, to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this present Order.

Wreck of a Russian frigate.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, of the loss of the Russian frigate Oleg, by collision, on the 3rd of August last, in the Baltic Sea.

The wreck lies in about 38 fathoms, on a line between the islands of Sommars and Hogland, distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the lighthouse on the South end of the latter island, and when last seen the mast heads were level with the water's edge.

(No. 67.)—Australia—Spencer Gulf.

Alteration of Tipara Floating Light,

THE Marine Board of South Australia has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of January, 1870, the lights now exhibited from the light-vessel on Tipara reef, on the east side of Spencer gulf, will be placed by a light vessel exhibiting a *fixed* white light, 35 feet above the level of the sea, which in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles, or when much refraction exists from a distance of 13 miles.

THE United States Government has given notice, that a new steam fog whistle has recently been erected at West Quoddy light station, south side of entrance to Eastport Bay, and that it will be sounded during snow-storms, and thick or foggy weather, for a period of eight seconds every minute, with an interval of fifty-two seconds between each blast.
