THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Portuguese Decree, of which the following are the Articles:—

1. The ports of Bissau and Cacheu, in Portuguese Guinea, are declared free ports for the trade of all nations.
2. All goods and merchandize imported into the said ports, under any flag, shall be exempt from the

payment of import duty on and after the 1st January, 1871.

3. The interior navigation of the rivers shall continue to be reserved to national vessels in accordance with the legislation of the Kingdom.

4. The Government shall adopt the proper measures in order to prevent any loss to the public revenue, from the abolition of the duties which are at present levied at the Custom-houses of Bissau and Cacheu.

5. All legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked.
