Bv the fait Letters from Croatia we are informed, that the Furks are moving on those Frontiers, fince they underflood that the Militia of Croatia was gone to joyn the Imperial Forces at Effecke, and that a Party of 800 of the Infidels had attempted feveral times to make an Incurfion towards Carelstade, but that Count Joseph Rabata, who'commands there in the abscence of the Count de Herberstein, had so well guarded all the Passages, that in the laft attempt they made on the eighth inftant, he had fallen upon them with fuch fucces that he had killed and taken above 100 of them, with two Standards, which he has fent to the Emperour.

Hague, June 29.
