ARTICLE V .- That the Auditor of the District comprising the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union shall, in the statement required by the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to be transmitted to the Poor Law Commissioners of the securities of the officers of the said Union, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the said parish of Streatham for the time being, appointed under the authority aforesaid, together with the particulars in the said General Order required, and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.
