Hungary. The Duke of Parma has raifed fome Troops for the Service of the Venetians. At Naples there has been a most terrible Earthquake, which has laid a great part of that City in Ruins: The Town of Benevento is quite deftroyed, with the Death of near 7000 perfons; and the City of Avelino, and other places, have likewife f. ffered very much. The damage they fay amounts to above 50 Millions.

Vienna, June 20. The Duke of Lorrain's Illness continuing, there is now little appearance of his being in a condition to go into the Field this Summer ; And therefore all the General Officers that staid here to accompany his Highness to the Army, are gone to their Commands, and Orders have been fent to General Caprara to begin the Campagne. - There has been a difcourfe fince the Dukes Sickness, that the Elector of Bavaria would command the Emperors Forces, though it feems there was no ground for it ; For we understand by the Count de Caunitz, who is returned from Municke, that his Electoral Highnels continues in his Refolution not to go to Hungary this year. We have an account that Lieutenant General Serini came to Buda the 13th inftant, that the 14th end 15th he muftered the Bavarian Regiments of Horfe and Foct, which arrived there fome days before; And intended to March with them on the 17th towards Effecte. The Count de Thaun parted from hence yefterday to command the Troops that are appointed for the Blockade of Canifa. They write from Upper Hungary, that the Imperialist had defeated a party of Turks that was Plundering in the Neighborhood of Debrezen. Prince Charles Philip of Branfwick is made Colonel of the Regiment of Dragoons, lately commanded by Golonel Detinin, who has quitted the fame on account of his great Age.

Hamburgh, June 27. We are informed by feveral Perfors that are come from Holftein, That the Ring of Denmark arrived on Thurfday laft at Izeboe; And that his Majefly intended to go from thence to Glacklade. The Letters from Birlin advife, That the Elector of Brandenburg had on the 24th inflant received inte Homige of the States of Wat Country, which was performed with the usual Solemnity.

Hamburg, June 29. The King of Denmark Dined yeflerday at Bramflede; And arrived in the Evening at Gluckstadt. There are fix or feven Danish Men of War at Sea.

Hague, July 2. The Heer Van Diest has given in a Memorial concerning the Affairs of the Brandenburgh West-India Company. The Prince of Friezland is returned to Leemaerden. The States of Holland will separate this Week.
