Pierres des Portes.—A tower is in the course of erection on the Pierres des Portes; its height, at present, is 16 feet above the rock, and 18 feet above high water.

Boujaron.—A tower is in the course of erection on Boujaron Rock; its height, at present, is 6 feet above the rock.

Bouton.—A black and red buoy has been placed on Bouton Rock.

Couillons de la Porte.—A black buoy on the Couillons de la Porte.

La Basse du Boujaron.—A red buoy on La Basse du Boujaron.
