Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Constantinople, inclusing a copy of a Note from the Porte, announcing that Soulina has been declared a Free Port.

This note states that all merchandize may in future be imported into and exported from Soulina without paying customs duties; that such exemption shall not extend to goods sent from the town into the interior; that the prohibition existing against the importation of salt, tobacco, gunpowder, arms, and ammunition is not affected by this measure; and adds that facilities will be given for the acquisition of land on the Delta Isiand, for the purpose of erecting storehouses and sheds thereupon.
