Alteration of Buoyage—Berwick to Orfordness.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 93, dated 30th November, 1869, respecting the intended alteration in the buoyage between Berwick and Orfordness.

The Trinity House has given notice that those alterations are now being effected, and that the buoyage will henceforth be as follows:—

Coquet Island.

N.W. Coquet (can).—Red and white chequered.
S.W. Coquet (can).—Red and white striped.
N.E. Coquet (conical).—Red and white rings, with staff and triangle.

Pan Bush (can).—Red.

Sand Pit (can).—Red.

Hawley Point (conical).—Black with staff and globe.

Bondicair Bush (can).—Red.
