(No. 51.)—NORTH SEA.

Alteration in Position of Inner Eider Light-vessel.

THE Prussian Government has given notice, that the light and pilot vessel at the mouth of the Eider River has been moved to a new position, inside the bar, and is now moored in two fathoms with the following bearings, viz. :—

St. Peter's Church, N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.

Blauort Beacon, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

Position, lat. $54^{\circ} 15' 30''$, long. $8^{\circ} 34' 48''$ East from Greenwich.

Also, that outside the bar, in line with the black buoys, a *red conical buoy with staff and two balls* has been moored in three fathoms at low water, in lat. $54^{\circ} 15' 31''$ N., long. $8^{\circ} 32' 24''$ E, with the light-vessel bearing E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.

Directions.—To cross the bar when entering the river, vessels should steer for the Eider light-vessel on an E.S.E. course.

The depth of the bar at low water is one fathom.

The outer light-vessel has been moored in her former position.

BALTIC ENTRANCES—GREAT BELT.

Alteration in Holskov Reef Buoy.

The Danish Government has given notice, that the bell buoy on the Halskov reef has been changed to a buoy with a *white staff and a broom* the latter 20 feet above the sea.

Bishop Stortford Union.—Parish of Sawbridgeworth.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Sawbridgeworth, in the county of Hertford;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Sawbridgeworth, in the county of Hertford, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish of Sawbridgeworth, held at the Police Station in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 3rd day of March last, it was resolved, that the Churchwardens of the said parish should apply to the Poor Law Board for an Order to put in force so much of the statute hereinafter described as applies to the providing of a Vestry Room in the said parish.
