Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room for the purpose of holding any Vestry or other Meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Sawbridgeworth, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
