

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 53.)—ENGLAND—WEST COAST—BRISTOL CHANNEL.

Alteration in Position of Cardiff Grounds, Middle Buoy.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that in consequence of the Cardiff Grounds having extended in a southerly direction, and having washed away on the western side, the Middle Cardiff Buoy has been moved one cable to the south-eastward, and now lies in 4 fathoms at low water springs, with the following marks and bearings, viz:—

West End of Flatholm Island (at high water) in line with West End of Steepholm Island, S. by W.

Cardiff Hook Buoy, N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. $1\frac{3}{8}$ miles.

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation $22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Westerly in 1870.]

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the tonnage bounty awarded for a slave dhow, name unknown, captured on the 16th May, 1869, by Her Majesty's ship "Daphne."

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the said bounty are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the High Court of Admiralty, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Due notice will be given, by future advertisements in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and at the same time the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Derby, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Lichfield, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us, to have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said piece or parcel of land shall be and

be held to be in lieu of, and in substitution for, a portion amounting to nine pounds per annum of the annual grant of one hundred and fifty pounds heretofore payable by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, under the authority of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, which was published in the London Gazette of the tenth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

Schedule.

All that piece or parcel of land, comprising three acres two roods and twenty-seven perches, situate in the new parish of Saint Paul, Derby, in the county of Derby, bounded on the north and on parts of the east and west by land belonging to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, on the remaining part of the west and on part of the south by the parsonage house of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Derby, and on the remaining part of the east by the road leading from Derby to Alfreton, and on the south by Chester-street, and which piece or parcel of land is delineated and colored round with red on the plan hereunto annexed.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Ilton, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty-three pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
