

ARTICLE 8.

Vessels of war will always be exempt from light dues; also all merchant vessels measuring ten tons Turkish, or less.

ARTICLE 9.

The amount of dues to be discharged by each vessel is calculated according to her legal and official measurement, converted into Turkish tons of 792 okka each.

ARTICLE 10.

A reduction of five per cent. upon the amount of light dues will be allowed to vessels engaged in a regular postal service. Independently of what is said in Article 8, coasting vessels shall pay once per month, fishing vessels once a-year, the light-house dues fixed for vessels of 100 tons.

ARTICLE 11.

In consideration of the space required in steam vessels for stores or coal rooms, 40 per cent. will be deducted from the tonnage.

It is, however, well understood that if such a deduction has already been effected in their documents of nationality, they shall not be entitled to any further deduction.

ARTICLE 12.

The present tariff shall be subject to be increased or lowered according to the state of the budget of lighthouses to be drawn up by Government every year.
