

twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the fourth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to

the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the twenty-fifth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of London, that an Assistant Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the new parish of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town aforesaid, during the half-year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said vicarage of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Haddenham, in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and coloured round with red and blue upon the plan also hereunto annexed, to have and to hold the said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments shall be and be held to be in lieu of and in substitution for a portion amounting to fifteen pounds of the annual sum or stipend of fifty-five pounds, heretofore payable by us the said Commissioners to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, under the authority of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, published in the London Gazette of the sixth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, as from the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
