Captain Wildy in the Modena, with his Buffora Prizes, was not arrived, but daily expected at Bombay. Magols old Governour at Surrat was turned out, and a new Governour fent thither in his flead; who shewed great kindness to the English, remaining there, and was entred into a Treaty of Peace with the English General, Resident at Bombay, which it was supposed would take sail essection as very short time. In Bengall, the English Agent, Mr. Job Charnock, had made Peace with the Nabob of Decca's Commissioners, which only wanted the Nabob's Ratification; but on that fide of India there had been great Sicknesses and Mortality, as also on the Coast of Choromandell, ensuing their great Famine; informuch, as that at Metchlegatam, of many Dutch Servants, but three were left sive; and of the French, but one Person; the English escaped some. what better, by removing into the Country.
