THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, enclosing a copy of a Decree of the Spanish Government, dated 15th July last, approving the new General Customs Ordinances:—

DECREE.

(Translation).

ART. 1. The General Customs Ordinances,* drawn up in fulfilment of the law of the 1st July, 1869, are approved.

ART. 2. These Ordinances will come into force on the 1st November next.

ART. 3. From the prescription of Art. 2 is excepted the disposition which requires masters of vessels to have a manifest of their cargoes ready drawn up on entering Spanish waters. That disposition will come into operation on 1st January, 1871, for vessels arriving from all ports in Europe, all ports of Asia and Africa in the Mediterranean, and African ports on the Atlantic as far as Cape Mogador; and on 1st April, 1871, for vessels arriving from all other ports in Asia and Africa, and from all ports in America and Oceania.

Until this disposition comes into operation, masters of vessels must come provided with the

Consular-Register as hitherto; on and after the 1st November, however, those who wish it may cease to provide themselves with the register, and subject themselves at once to the formation of the aforesaid manifest.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, a copy of an Order addressed by the Spanish Colonial Minister to the Governor of the Philippine Islands, modifying Articles 42, 156, 157, 158, and 159 of the Customs Regulations in force in those Islands. The above-mentioned Articles will in future be respectively worded as follows:—

ART. 42. If the examination shows minus differences in the number, weight, measure, or value of the effects, then, for the payment of the duty, that which is manifested in the declaratory notes shall be abided by; but where there are plus differences, whether in quality or quantity, Arts. 156 and 157 shall be observed.

ART. 156. If, on examining and comparing goods of lawful commerce with the declarations of the parties interested, there be found in the goods a plus or minus difference in quantity or quality not exceeding 4 per cent., they shall be despatched according to the result of the said acts. When the plus differences in quantity or quality between that which is found and that which is declared exceeds 4 per cent., the parties interested shall suffer an additional duty equal to the difference between the duty to have been paid on the goods according to the declarations and the duty to be applied in consequence of the result of the examination. As regards oil, dried cod fish, greases, soap, butter, and other oleaginous goods liable to waste away, plus or minus differences shall not be accounted as such, if they do not exceed 5 per cent. in goods coming from Asia, and 8 per cent. in goods coming from other countries. For calculating the rate per cent. of the differences that may appear in one and the same despatch, and the

amount of the additional duty according to the basis laid down in the second paragraph of this Article, all those belonging to one item of the Tariff shall be taken together (even although the goods be in different packages), to deduce therefrom that which ultimately constitutes the fraud attempted. If the merchandise be woven goods, the calculation shall be made by taking together all those of the same class, even although they belong to different items of the Tariff, taking care not to mix up plain goods with goods in imitation of serge (asargados), nor embroidered with unembroidered goods.

The amount of the additional duty spoken of in this Article shall be divided between the Exchequer and the employés.

ART. 157. When the differences are produced by the appearance of less goods, or of other goods liable to lower duty than the goods declared, duty shall be exacted on the whole of the goods set forth in the declaration. Goods of lawful commerce which, not having been declared, may be found fraudulently hidden, shall be confiscated.

ART. 158. If, on making the examination and valuation of duty, prohibited goods are found, which the parties interested may have declared as considering them allowed, a fine of the fourth part of the value thereof shall be imposed, and divided between the Exchequer and the employés concerned in the discovery. The owners shall be obliged to re-export, and in the meantime the goods shall remain in the Custom-house in deposit. If the said goods shall not have been declared, they shall be confiscated. If they have not been declared and are found fraudulently hidden, they shall be confiscated and an additional duty shall be imposed equal to the value of the goods. The amount of this additional duty, which, like the confiscated goods, shall be divided in equal parts between the Exchequer and the employés concerned in the discovery, shall be the price fetched by the goods in public auction, and not the amount of the valuation. For the re-exportation ordered in any of these cases, the administrator shall exact from the proper person a sufficient guarantee, to be held until the presentation of the certificate of the Spanish Consul at the port to which the goods are exported, stating that they have been received there. A fine of 400 escudos shall be imposed for the non-presentation of the said document within the term to be fixed at discretion.

ART. 159. When passengers bring unregistered goods exceeding 200 escudos in value, the goods to that amount shall first be set on one side, and the rest shall be charged double the respective Tariff duty. If the goods have not been declared, double duty shall be charged on the whole; but if, besides this, they have been fraudulently hidden in secret compartments of boxes, or in any other manner, they shall be confiscated.

Forden Union.—Parish of Berriew.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Berriew, in the county of Montgomery;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Berriew, in the county of Montgomery, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry, held at the Vestry Room in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Saturday, the 9th day of April last, it was resolved that the Churchwardens and Overseers apply to the Poor Law Board for an Order for the appointment of a Vestry Clerk; and application in writing has been made to the Poor Law Board accordingly.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say;—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Berriew.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of eighteen pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to Parliament in the session of 1871, for an Act for effecting (amongst others) the following objects, or some of them; that is to say: For amending, varying, extending, enlarging, or repealing certain of the powers and pro-

visions of the following public general Acts; that is to say: an Act passed in the 59th year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter 86; an Act passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter 43; and an Act passed in the 24th and 25th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter 40; and for explaining, amending, or altering the awards of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter 43, and the rules referred to in such awards; for the decision or settlement of divers questions which have arisen upon or in connection with the construction of such Acts, awards, and rules, or some of them; for the provision of a new system of the registration of titles to gales and leases, and of interests therein respectively; for the appointment of one or more Commission or Commissions for the above-mentioned purposes, or some of them; for conferring all necessary powers upon such Commission or Commissions, and for giving effect to the award or awards to be made by the same Commission or Commissions; for making provisions as to the surrender of gales, and the uniting and division of the same, and for setting out the boundaries thereof, and as to the renewals of leases of quarries; for altering the period for computation of dead rents or minimum rents of gales, and for the better recovery of galeage and dead rents; for the more convenient inspection of accounts of gales, or persons holding from or under them, and for insuring uniformity in the scale of plans of workings, and for requiring the keeping of weighing machines; for making further provision as to the costs of arbitrations, and generally for the better working and management of mines and quarries in the Forest of Dean and hundred of St. Briavel's, in the county of Gloucester, and for the registration of titles thereto and interests therein, and the recovery of rents or royalties payable in respect of the same; for making provision for expenses, and for the payment of fees for registration; for imposing penalties and providing for the recovery thereof. The Act will vary or extinguish all rights, powers, and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects, and will confer other rights, powers, and privileges. The Act will also contain all pro-

visions necessary or incidental to any of the purposes aforesaid.
