THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, two Despatches from Her Majesty's Consul at Rome, reporting—

Firstly. That the custom-house line which divided the Roman provinces from the other provinces of the King of Italy has been suppressed, and that the Customs Tariff at present in force in the Kingdom of Italy will after the 1st November, 1870, come into operation in the Roman provinces.

Secondly. That in accordance with a Royal Order, the following laws are published in Rome and the Roman provinces:—

The Law of 24th August, 1862, for the unification of the monetary system.

The Law of 21st July, 1866, approving the Monetary Convention of the 23rd December, 1865.

Until, however, new dispositions came into force, the Pontifical Edict of 18th June, 1866, will continue to have effect, but only so far as it concerns the legal currency of gold, silver, and bronze pieces of papal coinage named in that Edict.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a Decree issued by the King of Prussia, in the name of the North German Confederation, revoking the prohibition imposed upon

the export and transit of cattle, pigs, and sheep, as well as upon coal and coke, on the frontier.

The following are the Articles of this Decree:—

1. The prohibition of the export and transit of cattle, pigs, and sheep over the frontier from Nordhorn to Saarbrücken, both places inclusive, contained in Section 1 of the Ordinance of July 20 of the present year is removed.

2. The prohibition of the export and transit of coals and coke over the frontier from Memel to Saarbrück, both places included, contained in Section 1 of the Ordinance of July 16 of the present year, ceases to be in force as regards the frontier southwards from Malmedy to Saarbrück, inclusive.

1. That yachts belonging to a regularly organized yacht club of any foreign nation which shall extend like privileges to the yachts of the United States, shall have the privilege of entering or leaving any port of the United States without entering or clearing at the Custom-house thereof, or paying tonnage tax.
2. That United States yachts shall be furnished with a Commission by the Secretary of the Treasury so that they may be identified in foreign ports.
