

or parts thereof. Fourth, the appointment of one or more Commission or Commissions for effecting all or some of the above mentioned objects. The conferring all necessary powers upon such Commission or Commissions, and the giving effect to the award or awards to be made by, or by virtue of such Commission or Commissions. The definition of the powers, duties, and remuneration of the Commissioners, and of the duration of their offices respectively with provisions for the payment of such remuneration, and of the expences of such Commission or Commissions as aforesaid. Fifth, the Act will vary or extinguish all rights, powers, and privileges, which would interfere with any of its objects, and will confer other rights, powers, and privileges. The Act will also contain all provisions necessary or incidental to any of the objects aforesaid.

East and West Junction Railway.
(Extension of Time for Completion of Works authorized by the East and West Junction Railway Act, 1864.)

Humber Conservancy.

(Confirmation of Agreements with Commissioners of Woods and Forests and Board of Trade; Transfer of Foreshores and Property in Humber, Ouse, and Trent to Conservancy Commissioners; Power to raise Loan; Amendment of Public and Local Acts; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act for the following purposes, or some of them.

1. To confirm an agreement dated the 18th day of June, 1870, made between the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, of the first part, the Honourable Charles Alexander Gore, a Commissioner of Her Majesty's Woods, Forests, and Land Revenues, of the second part, and the River Humber Conservancy Commissioners, of the third part, for the purchase by the Humber Conservancy Commissioners of Read's Island and Ferriby Sands, in the River Humber, with the surrounding foreshore, or any other agreement made for the time being between the same or other parties respecting the same property, or part thereof, with or without other property.

2. To authorise the payment of the purchase money for the said island, sands, and foreshore to be made out of the gross proceeds to arise from the sale and dealings with the Humber foreshores under "The Humber Conservancy Act, 1868," and the lease granted by the Board of Trade in pursuance of that Act, and for that purpose (if and as far as may be necessary) to vary that Act and that lease, or to provide otherwise for the payment of the purchase money aforesaid.

3. To authorise the several bodies contributing to the Humber Conservancy Fund, or any of them, to advance any money belonging to them or at their disposal to the Humber Conservancy Commissioners, for the purposes of the execution by them of the agreement aforesaid, or to guarantee or otherwise give or join in giving any security, principal or collateral, for any money borrowed by the Humber Conservancy Commissioners for those purposes.

4. To confirm an agreement for the time being made between the Board of Trade and the Humber Conservancy Commissioners for a lease by the Board of Trade to the Commissioners of parts of
