Lemberg of the 24th past tell us, that the Crown General parted the 18th from Basto; that the 21ft he arrived at Bukefzow, and that he intended to be the 27th at the place of general Rendezvous, which is not far from Zaloscie. The same Letters add, that Sultan Nuradin was marching with a confiderable body of Tartars to conduct a new Convoy of Provisions to Cami-

Vienna, July 18. The news of the Turks having abandoned Illocke is confirmed, which they did with fo much precipitation, that they had not time to withdraw their Cannon and Ammunition; but they nailed up the first to the number of 18 pieces, and fet fire to the Magazine, in which there were 300 Barrels of Powder, fo that the Imperialifts found the place quite destroyed. The Garison retired with the Turks of Peter Waradin to the Island of Sabas, in the Save; but our Hussars and Dragoons followed them so close, that they took part of their Baggage (laden on 20 Waggons) and cut in pieces those that guarded it; General Henfler continuing the pursuit with two Regiments of Dragoons. The great discourse at present is of the Siege of Belgrade, which will be undertaken fo foon as the Bavarian Forces, and those commanded by General Caraffa, have joyned the Army; and that the Elector of Bavaria is arrived there to command it in chief. In the mean time General Caprara advances towards the Save, to prepare every thing for the Imperial Armies passing that River; and to affist Prince Louis of Baden in his Enterprise upon Gradiska, by fending him such supplies as he may stand in need of. The Deputies from Valachia have had Audience of the Emperor, under whose Protection it's faid the Prince and States of that Country do offer to put themselves, with a promise to employ their Arms against the Infidels, according to such orders as they shall receive from his Imperial Majesty. There is a report here that Sigeth has either Capitulated, or is upon the point of doing it, upon the fame Conditions that were granted to those of Alba Regalis. This is certain that the Imperialitis have made thenselves Mafters of an Outwork not far from the principal Gate of that place; which is thereby very much incommoded. What was faid of Yeghen Baffa's reconciliation with the new Grand Visier, is again contradicted; our last advice was that Teghen continued encamped between Sophia and Belgrade, and that there was a little War between him and the Baffa of Be'grade, each cutting off the Friends and Creatures of the other, as they fell into his Power. The Duke of Lorrain begins to rife and to recover his Strength, but it's believ'd he will not be able to go into the Field this The Duke of Mantua is still at this Court, expecting the rest of his Retinue, though he has already a great attendance here. The Elector and Electorefs of Bavaria will be here to morrow.

Cologne, July 27. We are expecting here with some impatience his Holineis's Decision in the matter of our late Election. The Cardinal of Fustemberg went from hence this day to Bonne and intends to go the 8th of the next month to Liege.

Brussels, July 30. Our Governour General having named the Prince de Bergues to go and make the Complement of Congratulation to his Majesty of Great Brietain, upon the Birth of the Prince of Wales, he parted from hence the 25th Instant for England to acquit himfelf of this Commission. His Excellency went yesterday to Answerp to meet the Prince of Orange, who will be to morrow at Hookstraeten, which is about four miles from that City. The Letters from Vienna of the 18th instant, give us great hopes of the Duke of Lorrain's speedy recovery. In the mean, time the Elector of Bavaria will command the Imperial Army in Chief: He was expected the 19th instant at Vienna. The Mareschal d'Humieres arrived the 23d instant at Aix la Chapelle, and began the next day to drink those Waters.

The Prince of Orange parted from here Hague, July 30. the 20th instant for Zealand, from whence he will go and visit sluys, and the other places belonging to this State in Flanders. The Heer Van Citters our Ambassador in England is arrived

here to look after his private Affairs.

Marfeilles, July 26. We have advice by a Man of War, which arrived two days ago at Thoulon, that the French Fleet was retired from before Argiers, having with their Bombs reduced that place to a heap of Ruines. That the Mareschall d'Estree had ordered three Men of War to remain before the Port; and that the rest were gone to look after the Algierine Ships that were abroad. The French Galleys are on the Coast, and are expected to day or to morrow in this

Paris, August 4. The King returned this day to Marli, to pass the rest of the Week there. We had yesterday the news by an express, that the Baron de Pettenberg, Great Dean of Munster, was on the 28th past una-

nimously chosen Bishop by that Chapter.
