PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board, a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, in the words following; viz.:-

"Whereas by an Act passed in the last session of your Majesty's Parliament, entitled 'An Act ' for establishing a District Registrar of the High ' Court of Admiralty in England at Liverpool,' it was enacted that 'there shall be established in 'Liverpool a Registry of the High Court of 'Admiralty,' and that it shall be lawful for your Majesty ' from time to time, by Order in Council, ' to fix the limits of such Registry': And whereas, having taken the advice of your Majesty's Lord High Chancellor, we are of opinion that the limits of such Registry should be co-extensive with those of the district assigned by your Majesty's Order in Council of the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, to the County Court of Lancashire as its district for Admiralty purposes ; that is to say, should include the several districts of the County Court of Cheshire, holden at Chester, Birkenhead, and Runcorn, and of the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Warrington, St. Helen's, Liverpool, and Ormskirk, together with such parts of the sea adjacent to such districts to a distance of three miles from the shore thereof.

"We humbly beg leave to recommend to your Majesty that you will be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to fix the limits of such Registry accordingly."

Her Majesty, having taken the said memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
