Turin, Feb. 1. The Popes Nuncio having with much importunity follicited the Duke of Savoy for the continuance of the Marquis Villa, and the Savoy Companies in the fervice of the Venetians for the defence of Candia 3 the Duke has been so far prevailed upon, as to acquaint the Venetian Ambassador, by the Marquiss del Borgo, of his final resolution, that he is contented for the service of that Republique that those Companies shall be for this next Summers fervice continued in their employment, but that his necessities oblige him to call home the Marquiss Villa: the Duke continues with much diligence to fortifie his Frontiers, especially those upon the borders of Milan.

Venice, Feb. 3. We have not of late received any Letrers from the Levant, only from Zante we are told of the arrival there of General Vertmilier, and Marethal Wrangle, who intend inddenly for this place, by whom we may re-ceive a farther account of the State of our affairs in Can-

From Dalmatia we are advertised, that a considerable party of the Turks made lately an intoad into the Countrey about Zara, where they laded themselves with much Booty, and were returning with a great number of priloners, and many thousand head of Cattle; but the Morlaiks having intelligence of them, pursued them upon their return, and overtaking them in their own Territories, gave them so home a charge, that after some little dispute, they routed them, killing many of them upon the place, taking some numbers of them priloners, with the Officer who commanded them, redeeming all their Captives, and recovering all their Prey.

ons, or being preflet for Souldiers.

A Barque putting in here from Palermo, informs us, that in a lete from of Thunder and Lightning happening there, 200 Barrels of Powder which were kept in a Bastion near the New Gate of the Town, to k Fire, which blew up the Bailtion, and the Gate adjoyring killing 20 perions, that by reason of the Rain that fell, were fireling themselves under the Arch of the Gate, and about 35 spamiards which were upon the Guards, doing a fo confiderable damage to the neighbouring parts of the Town,

Rome, Feb. 4. A late Express arriving from France, has brought to the French Ambassadour 2 new Commission. enlarging his Employment here for two years longer: The Abbot Tellier intends suddenly to return into France's on Sunday last he was privately entertained by Cardinal Rofptgliofi; who had with him above five hours Conference. On Monday his Holineis held a private Confistory in the Quirimal, where was performed the Ceremony of Shutting the Mouths of the New Cardinals Rolpigliof, Chigy, and d'Este; where also several Bishopricks were proposed and disposed of, and the Cardinal de Vendosme elected by the the Pope his Legate & latere, the more honourably to represent his Person at the Baptisme of the Dauphin of France.

A Squadron of the Popes Gallies are fitting up with all diligence, for the affiftance of the Venetians this next Spring, and are to be commanded by Bali Vintenzo Rospigliofi the Pop.s Nephew. The Pope continues daily to oblige the people, by taking off from them feveral Tixes and Impositions, and frequently expressing his devotions by several acts of Charity.

The Archbishop of Larissa, at present Nuncio in Po-

land, is by hun nominated for his Nuncio in Ofdinary to r'e Emperour, and Monsegnior Mareschotti, sommerly an Assessor in the Congregation of the Holy Office, to be

fent for Peland in his room.

The 24th of the last moneth died here the Cardinal Palotta, In the 75th year of his Age and 38th of his Prometion, and was the next day enterred with much Solemnity in the Church of the Holy Ghoft.

Some dayes fince arrived here the Count de Rabata, dispatched hither from the Great Duke of Fuscany, to complement his Holinels, with a return of thanks for the late promotion of Prince Leopold his Brother, to a Cardinal ship; who also presented the Pope and the Cardinal Patron with Presents of very considerable value.

The Queen of Swadeland is expected here the next Spring, for whom a Palace is already furnishing.

Vienna, Feb. 5. About 4 days fince arrived he e MonGeur de Griffenklam, Envoye from His Highnels the Elector of Mayence, but has not as yet appeared at the Court, not is any day appointed for his Audience: 'ris believed his principal business is to assure the Emperour of the sciendibip and fincerity of his Master to the Austrian Family, which he will be ready to assist, in case the Peace and Treaty so much talked of, take not fuch effect as is desied. Here is lately arrived a Courier from Spain, his butiness not publickly known, but believed to be of great concernment, the Mas-quis de Grava, being immediately dispatche thither, de-parting from hence the next day. Another Courier arriving fron the Elector of Bavaris, brings news of the late decease of Madam the Electress.
