The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve*

o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at these Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Seal of the Duchy of Cornwall, appointing Arthur Tremayne, of Carclew, Esq., Sheriff of the County of Cornwall.

The Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of a Knight of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto Charles Robert Turner, Esq., late Senior Master of Her Majesty's Court of Queen's Bench at Westminster.

The Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of Richard, Marquess of Hertford, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, unmarried and without issue, on the twenty-fourth day of August last, the title and dignity of Marquess of Hertford devolved upon his cousin Francis Hugh George, now Marquess of Hertford, Lieutenant-General in Her Majesty's Army, as the eldest son and heir of Sir George Francis Seymour, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Admiral of Her Majesty's Fleet, deceased, who was the eldest son and heir of Hugh Seymour Conway, Esquire (commonly called Lord Hugh Seymour Conway), the fifth son of Francis, first Marquess of Hertford, and that according to the ordinary rules of honor the brother and sisters of the said Francis Hugh George, now Marquess of Hertford, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their said late father had survived the said Richard, late Marquess of Hertford, and had thereby succeeded to the title

and dignity of Marquess of Hertford, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that William Frederick Ernest Seymour, Esquire, a Captain and Lieutenant-Colonel in Her Majesty's Regiment of Coldstream Guards, Emily Charlotte, wife of William Richard Ormsby Gore, Esquire, Representative in Parliament for the County of Leitrim, Matilda Horatio Seymour, Spinster, and Laura Williamina, wife of Victor Ferdinand Francis Eugenius Gustavus Adolphus Constantine Frederick, Count Gleichen, Captain in Her Majesty's Fleet, the brother and sisters of the said Francis Hugh George, now Marquess of Hertford, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father the said Sir George Francis Seymour had survived his cousin the said Richard, late Marquess of Hertford, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Marquess of Hertford:

And to command that the said order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

THE following Amended Rules for the Port of Aden, are published at the request of the Government of Bombay:—

ADEN PORT LIMITS.

NOTIFICATION.

The following are declared to be the limits of the Port of Aden:—

To the North and West:

From the Khor Mucksa, along the low sandy shore, to Iezerat Salil (Little Aden).

To the South:

A straight line drawn from Iezerat Salil (Little Aden) to the Northern Shore of Iezerat Denafah (Round Island).

To the East:

From Round Island, following the coast past Ras Tarshaine, Ras Morbut, and the Hedjoff, to Khor Mucksa.

The following are declared to be the limits of Front Bay (a portion of the Port of Aden):—

To the South:

A line drawn due east, half a mile from Ras Marshag.

To the East:

A line drawn from the outer point of the Southern limit due North, to a line drawn due East from Rasel Eregh.

To the North:

The line drawn due East from Rasel Eregh.

To the West:

From Rasel Eregh, following the coast to Ras Marshag.

The following are declared to be the limits of Fisherman's Bay (Bunder Duras), a portion of the Port of Aden:—

All that space included within a straight line drawn from Ras Marshag to Ras Tye.

The following are the defined limits of the Inner and Outer Harbour:—

Inner Harbour.

All that space included within a straight line drawn from Ras Morbut through the light vessel to the opposite coast.

Outer Harbour.

All that space without the aforesaid straight line, and within the southern limit.

ADEN PORT REGULATIONS.

Compiled from various Acts of the Legislative

Council of India, orders of the Governor in Council, Bombay, and local rules.

NOTE.—Aden was made a free port under Act X. of 1850.

The levy of port dues was authorized by Act XV. of 1858, and the amount was fixed by Government Notification, dated 8th April, 1870. Government Notification, dated 12th May, 1858, declared the Port subject to Act XXII. of 1855, Act I. and Act XII. of 1870 (the Quarantine and Native Passenger's Ships Act), are also in force.

PART I.

PILOTAGE.

1. Every vessel above 200 tons on entering or leaving the Inner Harbour of Aden shall take a Pilot, and while he is on board, she shall fly her national flag, between sun rise and sun set, or as long before and after as the flag may be visible. She shall also show her number on entering the Port.

2. The taking a Pilot on board for vessels anchoring in the Outer Harbour is optional.

3. A Pilotage due of one anna for every registered ton of burden shall be chargeable in respect of every sea-going vessel of the burden of ten tons and upwards (fishing boats excepted) which shall enter the Inner Harbour.

4. No Pilotage will be charged in respect of any vessel anchoring in the Outer Harbour, unless a Pilot is taken on board.

5. All vessels arriving off the Port of Aden and wishing to enter the Inner Harbour, shall fly the Pilot Jack at the fore, and every such vessel to remain in the Outer Harbour until boarded by a Pilot.

6. Any other vessel wishing a Pilot shall also fly the Pilot Jack at the fore.

7. No vessel drawing over seventeen and a half feet will be piloted into the Inner Harbour, unless the officer commanding the vessel sign a certificate to the following effect:—

“That when once moored, should his vessel ground at low water, he will take all responsibility upon himself.”

8. Ships or other vessels in harbour requiring a Pilot are to apply in writing to the Conservator for one:—24 hours' notice to be given.

9. If a Pilot proceeds on board a ship (when requested) to take her to sea, and his services for that purpose are dispensed with for that day by reason of the ship not being ready, a fee of rupees five will be charged by the Harbour Master for the attendance of the Pilot.

10. Pilots (except on an emergency) will not be supplied to out-going vessels on Sundays, or between sunset and daybreak.

11. Every vessel shall be bound to take such berth as may be appointed for her by the Conservator of the Port, and to remove from one berth to another when required by such authority to do so.

12. All vessels within the Port of Aden shall moor and unmoor according to the orders of the Conservator.

13. On application to the Conservator, a vessel above 200 tons may be moved from one mooring or anchorage to another, approved by that officer, on payment of a fee of half an anna for every registered ton of the burden of such vessel; and no vessel exceeding 100 tons burden shall be moved without the permission of the Harbour Master: persons convicted of so doing will be liable to a penalty not exceeding rupees two hundred.

PART II.

PORT DUES.

14. A port due of one anna for every registered ton of burden shall be chargeable in respect of every sea-going vessel of the burden of 10 tons and upwards (fishing boats excepted) which shall enter the port.

15. No such due shall be chargeable in respect of any vessel, which, having left the Port, is compelled to re-enter it by stress of weather, or in consequence of having sustained any damage.

16. The port due shall not be chargeable oftener than once in the same calendar month in respect of the same vessel.

17. Vessels calling at the Port for letters or fresh provisions, or to send telegrams, to be exempt from port dues, provided no cargo or passengers are embarked or disembarked. (This is not to apply to passengers landing for a few hours only.)

18. Vessels taking in coals for steaming or cooking or condensing purposes only, to be charged half port dues, provided cargo or passengers are not embarked or disembarked.

19. Vessels entering the Port in ballast shall be charged with three-fourths of the port dues which would otherwise be chargeable.

PART III.

MOORINGS.

20. No vessel shall use any of the Government chain moorings, whether fixed or swinging, without permission of the authorities.

21. Every vessel occupying Government moorings, whether fixed or swinging, shall pay for them according to the following scale:—

Vessels remaining more than seven days shall, after that time, pay one-fourth only of the above scale per diem for such subsequent period.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

22. Every vessel in the Inner Harbour of Aden shall have her flying jibboom rigged in; she shall also rig in her jib and driver booms, and shall strike her yards if required by the Conservator to do so.

23. Ballast and cargo boats are not permitted to hang on astern of ships.

24. Every vessel in the Port of Aden shall remove any anchor, or spar, or other substance projecting from her side when required to do so by the Conservator.

25. Free passages are to be kept to all piers, jetties, landing places, wharves, docks, and moorings, and all vessels shall be bound to move when required by the authorities to clear such passages.

26. No vessel is to throw ballast, dirt, or refuse overboard, within the limits of the Harbour, and

any person convicted thereof shall be liable to a penalty—

For the first offence, Rs.200

„ second „ „ 600

27. No person shall be permitted to take sand, stone, or soil from any place within the limits of the harbour, without previously obtaining permission from the authorities; and any person or persons so doing shall be liable to a fine—

For the first offence, not exceeding Rs.100

„ second „ „ 300

28. No vessel shall cast off a warp, that has been made fast to her to assist a vessel in mooring, unless required to do so by the Pilot or Officer in charge of the vessel mooring.

29. No lines, warps, kedges, &c., are to be kept out after a ship is moored.

30. All square-rigged vessels in the Harbour of Aden are to keep a clear hawse.

31. Every vessel exceeding the burden of 200 tons shall be provided with a proper force pump, hose, and appurtenances, for the purpose of extinguishing any fire that may occur on board. The master of any such vessel who, after having been required by the Conservator to comply with such provision, shall, without lawful excuse, neglect or refuse to do so for the space of seven days after such requisition, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 200.

32. All sea-going vessels, when at anchor in the Inner or Outer Harbour, shall, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding 20 feet above the hull, a white light in a globular lantern of 8 inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light all round the horizon at the distance of at least one mile.

33. No boats to ply as cargo boats, except under licence, as provided for by section 68 Act I., of 1852.

34. No master or owner of a vessel shall grave, beam, or smoke such vessel without first giving notice to the Conservator.

35. No vessel shall boil pitch, or dammer, or other inflammable substance on board, or shall draw off spirits by candle or other artificial light, and every caution shall be taken to guard against fire.

36. Except in cases where assistance is required, no private vessels are, without permission, to hoist signal lights at night, or burn blue lights, fire rockets, discharge guns, or fire-arms of any description, at the hours of sunset and sunrise, or at any other time.

37. No person, unless duly authorised by the Conservator of the Port, shall sweep or creep for anchors, cables, or other stores lost, or supposed to be lost. Every person offending against this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding rupees one hundred.

38. Sick seamen may be admitted into the European General Hospital on application being made to the Port Surgeon, for the expenses of which seamen the Master of the vessel will be held responsible, at the rate of rupee (1) one per diem per each man. Twelve hours' notice is required, except in cases of emergency.

39. The shipping are forbidden to send boats to the northern side of the harbour, or to little Aden, without permission of the authorities.

Note.—On vessels entering the harbour, the depth of water is shown by flags hoisted on board the Light Vessel.

PART V.

CUSTOMS LAW.

40. Within twenty-four hours after the vessel's arrival, the commander is to deliver into the Customs Office, Steamer Point, a true and perfect manifest of his cargo and stores. He will attend in person to acknowledge his signature to it, before it can be admitted to entry. The manifest should include all goods, the property of the crew, &c., under a penalty of Rs. 1,000 in case of omission; and the number of packages must be inserted in words as well as in figures.

41. If any person shall attempt to pass any goods or stores, either for importation or exportation, without having presented for countersignature by the Customs authorities, a written application, or if the goods entered in such application be wilfully misdescribed, either as regards quantity, quality, or value, such goods shall be liable to confiscation, which penalty may be commuted to a fine, not less than one-tenth of the market value of such goods, at the discretion of the adjudicating officer.

42. Commanders of vessels are to report at the Custom House, within eight hours after arrival at the Port of Aden, the quantity (if above ten pounds) of gunpowder which they may have on board, under a penalty not exceeding Rs. 500.

43. Every vessel leaving Aden will, previous to sailing, deliver to the Custom House an account of the export cargo. The officer in charge of the Customs, as soon afterwards as may be practicable, will furnish to the commander a manifest for the same duly authenticated.

44. No goods to be allowed to leave any vessel entering the Port of Aden until entry shall have been duly made at the Custom House, under penalty not exceeding Rs. 500.

45. Masters of vessels are in all cases liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 500 for every package duly manifested that is missing on board, unless the deficiency be duly and satisfactorily accounted for, obvious and unintentional errors in the manifest, may, however, be altered at the discretion of the Customs authorities.

46. Commanders of vessels when applying for a Port clearance, are required to produce at the Custom House a certificate from the Harbour Master, the European General Hospital at Steamer Point, and the Police Court, that all claims against them have been adjusted, as also a certificate of registry of the vessel, a list of the crew, and (if any) of the passengers.

47. If any goods be taken on board after a Port clearance is granted, the master must amend the export manifest in the presence of the officer in charge of Customs, or any other authorized person, under a penalty not exceeding rupees one thousand.

48. Any vessel attempting to depart without a Port clearance will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 1,000, excepting vessels passing through without embarking or disembarking cargo or passengers, and for all claims on which Local Agents (who have been accepted by the authorities) agree to hold themselves responsible. Such vessels may leave without Port clearance, provided they have complied with the Police and other regulations of the Port through their agents. These agents will be liable to the prescribed penalties for non-observance of the aforesaid rules on the part of their principals.

49. Any packages passed either for importation or exportation not found to contain quantity, sort, or value as described in the application for passing it, will be liable to confiscation, which

penalty may be commuted at the discretion of the adjudicating Officer, to a fine not less than one-tenth of the market value of such goods.

50. All parcels or packages imported by vessels carrying Her Majesty's mails, &c., which the Customs authorities may consider necessary to order to be taken to the Custom House, shall pay landing and all other charges.

51. Commanders of vessels may forward any unclaimed goods, other than of an explosive nature, to the Custom House, where they will be allowed to remain three months, after which (if not claimed) they will be sold by public auction.

52. If the Assistant Political Resident in charge of Customs shall see cause to search any vessel, he may issue a warrant or written order for such search; and any person or persons obstructing any Officer holding such warrant, when in the execution of his duty, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,000.

PART VI.

POLICE REGULATIONS.

53. Commanders of vessels are to give twenty-four hours' notice at the Assistant Political Resident's Office, Aden, in writing previous to their sailing; and no person whatever is to be taken from Aden without permission being obtained from the Political Resident or his Assistants; and in no case will permission be granted for the shipping of any Europeans or natives as seamen, unless such seamen appear in person at the Police Court to sign the ship's articles; any evasion of, or attempt to evade this clause, will be punishable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 600.

54. No vessel, whether British or Foreign, shall discharge any one of their crew in Aden, without permission being obtained from the Political Resident or his Assistants; and the commanders of all vessels, whether British or Foreign, shall, on their arrival, deliver in a statement to the Assistant Political Resident, containing a correct list of their crew, as also of any other person they may have on board. Any breach of this regulation will be punished by a fine not exceeding Rs. 600.

55. No bathing is allowed in the neighbourhood of high road.

56. Commanders of vessels laden with coal, who require the services of labourers to assist in discharging their cargo, are recommended to apply to the Police authorities at Steamer Point, who will render them every possible assistance. They will thus be secured from imposition, and from the annoying importunities of the Somali labourers.

57. Commanders of vessels, whether square-rigged or country craft, having pilgrims on board, are not allowed to communicate with the shore before they have been visited by the Port Surgeon or his Deputy. Within six hours of permission being granted, the commander or one of his officers should attend at the Police Court to give a true account of the number of pilgrims on board, and, if required, to obtain permission to land them. Any commander of a vessel landing or allowing pilgrims to land, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 10 for each individual so landed.

58. Vessels arriving from a Port where, or in the neighbourhood of which, any contagious disease is present, or not having a clean bill of health, or on the board of which there is or has been during the voyage a contagious disease of any kind, shall hoist a yellow flag at the fore, and shall conform to the local quarantine regulations.

59. Any infringement of the aforementioned rules; either as concerns pilotage or general rules, will be visited with penalties other than those already named, according to the degree of the offence, such penalties not to exceed rupees three hundred.

60. The Aden Police Court in town, and Treasury, are open every day for the dispatch of general business (Sundays and holydays excepted.)
