

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Gloucestershire, holden at Gloucester.

In the Matter of William Henry Jackson, late of the Woodlands, in the county of Gloucester, Chemical Manufacturer, now of Coleford, in the said county of Gloucester, a Bankrupt.
