LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT OF HEWORTH, IN THE COUNTY OF DURHAM, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from owners and ratepayers resident within the boundaries of a proposed district of Heworth, in the county of Durham, praying me to settle the boundaries of such district for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been made by Arnold Taylor, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the Inspector's Report, dated the 22nd day of February, 1871, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the "Heworth District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The boundary of the proposed district of Heworth commences at the point A on the plan which accompanies the Inspector's Report, at low water mark of the River Tyne, opposite the east side of Stonygate-lane, and on the eastern boundary line of the district of the Felling Local Board; thence proceeding easterly along such line of low-water mark of the River Tyne to the point B, opposite Lizzie Moodie's Creek, on the boundary line which divides Heworth township from the township of Hedworth Monkton and Jarrow; thence, southerly, along such last-named township boundary line to the point C, on the south side of the high road leading from South Shields to Gateshead; thence, westerly, along and including such road to the point D, on the east side of the Ouston and Pelaw waggon-way; thence, southerly, along and including such waggon-way to the point E, on the south side of the high road leading from Sunderland to Gateshead; thence, westerly, along and including such last-named high road to the point F, on the east side of Stonygate-lane on the eastern boundary line of the district of the Felling Local Board; thence, northerly, along such boundary line to the starting point at A, so completing the boundary of the proposed district of Heworth.

2. That Jacob Burnett, Esq., Chemical Manufacturer, of Bill Quay, near Gateshead, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary, under the hereinbefore recited Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said district of Heworth to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district as fixed and settled by this Order. And in case of the failure or inability of the said Jacob Burnett, to discharge such duty of Summoning Officer, that Mr. Mathew Reay, Butcher, also of Bill Quay, near Gateshead, act in his stead.
