

hereby, subject as hereinafter-mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Shildon, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and now vested in us, to have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments with the appurtenances to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said piece or parcel of land shall be and be held to be in lieu of and in substitution for a portion, amounting to three pounds five shillings and fourpence, of the annual sum or stipend of twenty pounds heretofore payable by us the said Commissioners to the Incumbent of the said benefice under the authority of an instrument sealed by us on the eleventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the London Gazette of the nineteenth day of the same month and year: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments as from the twenty-fifth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

All that piece or parcel of land comprising twenty-four perches or thereabouts, situate at Shildon, in the county of Durham, being parcel of a close (formerly two closes) of land called "Town End Flatt," bounded on the west by the parsonage grounds of Shildon aforesaid, and on all other sides by land belonging to Samuel Smithson, and which said piece or parcel of land is delineated and coloured green upon the plan hereunto annexed.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Rosley-with-Woodside, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, one capital sum of one hundred and thirty pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Rosley-with-Woodside.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of certain tithe commutation rent charges, amounting together to the annual sum of one hundred and thirteen pounds sixteen shillings and sixpence, which have been permanently secured to the district of Ford End, in the county of Essex, and in the diocese of Rochester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Minister or Incumbent of the said district of Ford End, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said district in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
