Foreign Office, July 21, 1871.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Calais, a Despatch, dated the 13th instant, respecting Passports, of which the following is an extract:—

"I HAVE the honour to report that, notwithstanding the publicity given to the regulations at present in force regarding Passports in this country, cases still daily occur of persons landing at this port, either without a passport at all, or without the French *visa*: they are, in consequence, unable to proceed on their journey, and are either compelled to return to London or have to wait at Calais."
