"THE FAIRS ACT, 1871."

HARLESTON FAIRS, NORFOLK.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices of the Petty Sessional District of Earsham, in the county of Norfolk, that Fairs have been annually held in the town of Harleston, in the said district and county, on the 5th and 6th days of July, on the 9th and 10th days of September, on the third Wednesday in the month of September, and on the 12th day of October; and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871.":

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished:

And whereas His Grace the Duke of Norfolk, as lord or owner of the said Fairs, and the tolls thereof, has consented in writing that the said Fairs should be abolished:

Now therefore I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held in the town of Harleston, in the Petty Sessional District of Earsham, in the county of Norfolk, shall be abolished, as from the date of this order.
