CHEPPING WYCOMBE FAIR, BUCKS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 15th day of September, 1871, a representation has been duly made to me by the Town Council of the borough of Chepping Wycombe, in the county of Buckingham, that a Fair has been annually held in the month of September, within the said borough, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 20th day of October, 1871, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.
