

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Wiltshire, holden at Salisbury. In the Matter of Robert Rawlins, of Whitchurch, in the county of Southampton, Esquire, a Bankrupt.

UPON reading a report of the Trustees of the property of the bankrupt, dated the 12th day of September, 1871, reporting that so much of the property of the bankrupt as could, according to the joint opinion of the trustee and the committee of inspection, thereunto annexed in writing under hands, be realized, without needlessly protracting the bankruptcy, had been realized, but the same had been insufficient to pay any dividend whatever, and upon hearing the Solicitor for the trustee, the Court being satisfied that so much property as aforesaid has been realized, but that the same was insufficient to pay any dividend, doth order and declare that the bankruptcy of the said Robert Rawlins has closed.—Given under the seal of the Court this 22nd day of September, 1871.

In the County Court of Glamorganshire, holden at Cardiff. In the Matter of Mary Ann Reynolds, of the Cross Keys, Crockherbtown, Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, Innkeeper, a Bankrupt.

UPON reading a report of the Trustees of the property of the bankrupt, dated the 2nd day of October, 1871, reporting that the whole of the property of the bankrupt has been realized for the benefit of her creditors, and a dividend to the amount of two and five-eighths pence in the pound has been paid, the Court being satisfied that the whole of the property of the said bankrupt has been realized for the benefit of her creditors, and that a dividend to the amount of two and five-eighths pence in the pound has been paid, doth order and declare that the bankruptcy of the said Mary Ann Reynolds has closed.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 2nd day of October, 1871.
