In our last we gave you an account of what had palled in this Siege to the 16th: And of the Duke of Mantua's arrival; He Siege to the 16th: And of the Duke of Manua's arrival; He made his Entry into the Camp with a very numerous Train, and a Magnificent Equipage, having with him above 500 Men on Horfe back, including his Guards, 40 led Horfes, 24 Mules, 25 Wagons with Baggage, and a very fine Coach with 6 Hor-fes, followed by leveral others, and a great number of Ser-vants in Livery. The Elector of Bavaria, accompanied with the General Officers, went a Mile from the Camp to meet him, and conducted him to the Head Quarter, where they dined together, and after wards went to viit the Trenches y And in the mean time his Tents, to the number of 104, fome of which are very rich, were pitch'd between the Elector's Quarter and that of General Caprara. The 17th by break of day we ke-gan to batter the Walls of the Cattle with 6 pieces of half Cannon ; And underflood by a Deferter that the Edemy were hard at work in their Mines: In the Evening General Caprara Cannon; And understood by a Deterter that the Energy Werk hard at work in their Mines: In the Evening General Caprara being with the Elector in the Trenches, a Mulquet flot pals'd through his Hat and Perriwig, without doing him any harm. The 18th the Enemies Cannon and Small flot plaid very warm-ly; Count Gallenfells, a Bavarian Colonel, was in the Tren-ches wounded with a Mulquet Bullet in the Body, and the Lieu-temant. ing Country. The Duke of Lorrain is arrived at Buda. P. S. We are jult now told, that an Express is arrived with Advice, that there has been a tharp Engagement between Prince Louis of Baden, and the Baffa of Bolnia, and that after a Fight of feveral hours, the later was put to flight, having loft above 3000 of his Men; That the Turks had thereupon abandoned Debuza, Jaffenenviez, and Gradiska, having firft fet fire to them, and were retired towards Banyalucca, whither the Imperialifts followed them.

The States of Holland will re-affemble on the 15th inftant. The Heer Van Citters, Ambalfador from this State, will embark in a day or two in order to his return for England. The Count of Oxenfterne is coming hither in the Onality of Envoy Extraordinary from the Crown of Sueden. The Count d'Avaux, Ambalfador of France, prefented yellerday a Memorial to the States-General as follows:

That he had received Orders from the King his Master, to let them know, That whereas his Majesty is informed of the Motions and Cabals that are made towards the Frontiers of the Electorate of Cologne, against the Cardinal of Furstemberg and the Chapter, he is resolved to maintain the Cardinal and the Chapter in their Rights and Providedes, against all those that float go about to trouble them therein's this Majesty affuring himself, that those, that defire the Prefervation of the publick Transquility, will not come to any Att of Hostisht against the Cardinal and the Chapter, nor against the Places and Country of that Electorate, inhereof the Government and Administration do unguestionabit belong to them.
