WATTON FAIRS, NORFOLK.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices acting in and for the Petty Sessional District of Wayland, in the county of Norfolk, that certain Fairs have been annually held on the tenth day of July and the eleventh day of October in the parish of Watton, within the said district and county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished:

And whereas John Remington Mills, of Kingswood Lodge, Tunbridge Wells, in the county of Kent, Esquire, Lord of the Manor of Watton Hall, in Watton aforesaid; as lord or owner of the said Fairs and the tolls thereof, has consented in writing that the said Fairs should be abolished:

Now therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held on the tenth day of July and eleventh day of October, in the parish of Watton, within the Petty Sessional District of Wayland, in the county of Norfolk, shall be abolished as from the date of this order.

SAFFRON WALDEN FAIR, ESSEX.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce,

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

"That this Vestry having heard from the Overseers what steps have been pursued by them to obtain a suitable Vestry Room for the township, and it having been intimated by the Local Government Board that they would have no objection to the Heaton Norris Workhouse being purchased for the purpose, this Vestry doth hereby authorize the Overseers to apply to the

"Local Government Board to issue an order under their seal, to put in force in this township so much of the Statute 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57, as relates to the providing of a Vestry Room for the transaction of the ordinary public business of the township; and this Vestry doth hereby further authorize the Overseers, with the consent of the Local Government Board, to purchase from the Board of Guardians of the Stockport Union the building known as the Heaton Norris Workhouse, for the sum of £700, for the purpose aforesaid, the details as to the raising of the monies and mode of payment to complete the said intended purchase to be left to the discretion of the Overseers, this Vestry having full confidence in their judgment."

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made their application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution :

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the Act passed in fourteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," hereby order and direct that so much of the above Statute as relates to the providing of a room for the purpose of holding Vestry Meetings for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said township of Heaton Norris, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township.

And we direct that the said Overseers shall purchase the premises referred to in the before-mentioned resolution, belonging to the Guardians of the Poor of the Stockport Union, in the counties of Chester and Lancaster, for the sum of £700, to be used for the above purpose.

And we further order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 30th day of September, 1871.
