

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Warwickshire, holden at Birmingham.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Joseph Simpson, of Chester-street-wharf, Aston-road, Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, Coal Merchant.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said Joseph Simpson, having been given, it is ordered that the said Joseph Simpson be, and he is hereby adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 19th day of December, 1871.
