#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Note addressed to Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Yedo, by the Japanese Government, respecting the export of Rice:—

"Leaving the prohibition against the export of rice as it exists, it is intended henceforward when

there is a surplus in the country, as circumstances may demand, that some of the rice stored by the Board of Finance shall be sold at the open ports by public tender to Japanese and foreigners for exportation. The date for sending tenders will be notified on each occasion at the open ports. On certain occasions the Government may export on its own account."

## CLARE FAIRS.

1. By Memorial, dated the 4th day of March, 1872, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices acting in the Clare Division of Risbridge, in the county of Suffolk, that Fairs have been annually held on Easter Tuesday, and on the 26th and 27th days of July, in the parish of Clare, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished.

2. On the 22nd day of April, 1872, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fairs.

ARTICLE I.—So much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Saint Clement, Hastings.

ARTICLE II.—The Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the statutes in that behalf and of this Order, shall perform the following duties:—

- No. 1. To attend the meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.
- No. 2. To attend meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.
- No. 3. To assist the Churchwardens and Overseers in making out their accounts whenever required by them.
- No. 4. To assist the Overseers in making out Lists of Voters for Members of Parliament, and getting the same printed and published and duly returned according to law, and in preparing, making out, and publishing the Burgess Lists and Lists of Constables, when required.
- No. 5. To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office.

ARTICLE III.—An annual salary of ten pounds shall be paid to such Vestry Clerk by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

ARTICLE IV.—The salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable from the day on which he commences the performance of his duties up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, a proportionate sum being paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
