

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Berkshire, holden at Reading. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against John Fluett Clark, of Minster-street, Reading, in the county of Berks, Grocer.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said John Fluett Clark having been given, it is ordered that the said John Fluett Clark be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 18th day of May, 1872.
