

Description of Railway.

4. The railway is six furlongs, or thereabouts, in length, and will be wholly situate in the township of Frizington, and parishes of Arlecdon and Lamplugh, in the county of Cumberland, and will commence by a junction with the present railway of the Company at a point thereof in the parish of Arlecdon, distant twenty-five chains, or thereabouts, from and on the south-west side of Eskett Station, and will terminate by a junction with the said railway at a point thereof in the parish of Lamplugh, distant forty-five chains, or thereabouts, from and on the north-west side of Eskett Station aforesaid.

Tolls.

5. For the purposes of guage, construction, maintenance, tolls, fares, rates, and charges, and all other purposes, the railway shall be part of the railway and undertaking of the Company as if it had been authorised by any Act of Parliament relating to the Company; and the Company may demand, recover, and receive tolls, fares, rates, and charges accordingly.

Expenses of Certificate.

6. All the costs, charges, and expenses of and incident to the preparing and procuring this Certificate shall be paid by the Company.
